

SANITARY DISTRICT ELECTION DEC. 10TH

To Vote on Proposed Bond Issue to Erect Six Plants on North Shore

Estimated costs of the six proposed new disposal plants which it is to build in as many communities in Lake county, subject to the approval of the voters, were outlined by the North Shore Sanitary District board following its meeting, in its headquarters in the Waukegan National Bank building last Thursday morning.

It was also determined that the total cost of erection of the plants will be \$1,200,000 and the citizens will be asked to approve a bond issue for that amount in the election.

Announce Costs

The estimated costs of the six plants was outlined as follows: Winthrop Harbor, \$38,500; Waukegan, \$736,000; North Chicago (enlargement), \$124,500; Lake Forest, (addition) \$47,000; Highwood (addition) \$93,500, and Highland Park, \$160,000. The cost of the Waukegan plant represents more than two-thirds of the total cost.

Bond Election Dec. 20

The election was definitely set for Dec. 20 by the board at last week's meeting. This date falls on Saturday. Members of the board favored the holding of the election on Saturday so that more citizens would get the chance to vote on the issue.

Ample polling places will be established in all of the communities in the North Shore Sanitary district which extend from the north to the south line of the county and extends from the lake shore west to Waukegan road south of Rockland road and to Green Bay road north of that highway.

Plans Prepared

Plans for the six plants have been tentatively prepared by the firm of Pearse Greeley and Hanson of Chicago, engineers for the sanitary board. The final working plans will not be drafted until after the election.

The sanitary board is especially desirous of starting the work of erection of these plants as early as possible as a measure of reducing unemployment in this section.

Plans for the reception of the plant have been given the approval of the state water survey board, as it will mean the elimination of the pollution of the waters of the lake along the local shore and bring about healthier conditions in north shore cities.

Christmas Savings in Lake County Banks are Estimated at \$473,000

A \$437,000 blow at depression will be released within the next few weeks when Christmas club deposits held in Lake county banks, including three banks in Waukegan, will be released to subscribers. The 1930 total is less than five per cent below the 1929 total, bankers said today.

Savings club plans have been kept up regularly during the year in spite of general economic depression, banking officials said.

The \$473,000 is distributed among 13 banks in the county, the Waukegan National, Waukegan State, and the First National and Lake County State Bank of North Chicago, the Libertyville Trust and Savings bank, the First National, and the Lake County National banks of Libertyville, the Mundelein State bank, the Lake Zurich bank, the Zion bank and the First National Bank of Zion, the Highland Park State bank and the North Shore Trust company of Highland Park, the Highwood State bank, the Antioch State bank and the First National Bank of Antioch, the Lake Forest Trust and Savings bank, the Lake Forest First National bank, and the Barrington First National bank.

Amounts to be distributed in each city are as follows: Waukegan, \$190,000; North Chicago, \$50,000; Libertyville, \$43,000; Mundelein, \$3,000; Lake Zurich \$2,500; Highland Park, \$70,000; Lake Forest, \$84,000; Antioch, \$7,100; Highwood, \$7,000; and Barrington, \$12,000.

Several smaller banks in the county have not reported totals to be distributed.

Find Staghorn Sumac Grove, Chesterton, Ind.

A grove of staghorn sumac trees which seems previously to have escaped the attention of botanists, has been discovered near Chesterton, Indiana, by Paul C. Standley, associate curator in charge of the herbarium at Field Museum of Natural History, and Prof. Samuel J. Record, research associate in wood technology of the same institution. The grove consists of more than a 100 trees, some of which are 40 feet high and more than 25 inches in circumference. Mr. Standley reports. The discovery presents an interesting addition to the list of trees native to Indiana.
