POLLING PLACES FOR SANITARY DIST. VOTE

Where Residents of District
May Cast Ballots Dec. 20 on
Bond Issue Proposal

Establishment of 15 polling places in the district for the \$1,200,000 bond issue election to be held on Dec. 20 has been decided upon by the North Shore Sanitary board.

The money to be raised through the bond issue will meet the cost of erection of six new plants or additions to plants for sewage disposal on the north shore.

List of Plants

The largest of the plants is to be built at Waukegan. It with equipment will cost \$736,000. Other plants and additions to be built are as follows: Winthrop Harbor, \$38,500; North Chicago, \$124,500; Lake Forest, \$47,500; Highwood, \$93,500 and Highland Park, \$160,000.

Members of the Sanitary board in designating the polling places decided to locate them where the utmost facilities for voting would be afforded to all of the citizens in the district.

The polling places and their locations are designated as follows:

Polling Places

Winthrop Harbor, town hall; Zion, Twenty-sixth street school on Elm avenue, and Fire station on Sheridan road in Zion; Waukegan, Greenwood school on North avenue, Court house on Utica street side; Reid's filling station at 1404 Grand avenue, Charles Crapo garage on Belvidere street, Meyers green house on S. Genesee street; North Chicago, Fire station at Twelfth street and Park avenue, City hall at Eighteenth street and Sheridan road; Lake Bluff, Village hall on Center avenue; Lake Forest, American Legion hall on Forest avenue; Highwood, City hall; Highland

Park; Murray and Terry office at Central avenue and Sheridan road and in a store at 397 Roger Williams avenue.

Coast Guard Station Wanted at Waukegan; Seek Aid of Congress

Establishment of a coast guard station in Waukegan as a measure of protection to local boatmen as well as to crews of steamers on this section of the lake is asked in a resolution approved by the city council last week.

The resolution was offered by Commissioner Robert J. Pearsall after the subject had been brought to the attention of the council by Commissioner Nick Keller. It was passed by an unanimous vote of the council.

Copies of the resolution will be sent to Congressman Carl R. Chindblom and Senators Charles S. Deneen and Otis Glenn.

The council was inspired in its demands by the fact that many serious marine disasters have occurred in this section of the lake in recent years and likewise by the possibility that the steady development of the Waukegan harbor in volume of the tonnage will make the need of life-saving equipment more essential in these waters.

Indications are, however, that Waukegan will not obtain the coast guard station without a fight in Congress. Congressman Chindblom presented a bill asking for a coast guard station two years ago. It has come up for discussion several times in congress but failed of passage.

The home of Robert A. Hixon, contractor, on Cadmore road, near Beach road, north of Waukegan was burned to the ground with a loss of \$10,000 late last night.
