A hospital unit at Great Lakes will also be remembered with a Christmas party and suitable gifts.

An equally interesting part of the program was contributed by the Rev. Eugene J. McGuinness, who spoke of the thrilling beauty of the Oberammergau Passion Play and told of the deep-rooted goodness, simplicity and perfection of the daily lives of the players.
