Happenings About This Part of North Shore; Doings at County Seat

Julius F. Bidinger, a powerful factor in Waukegan politics for two decades, who retired from the firing line in 1921 when his term as mayor expired, is reported to be a certain candidate for the office of mayor in the spring in that city.

Bart Tyrrell, detective sergeant, Waukegan, possibly will be a candidate for city commissioner, it was stated last week by his friends, who are urging him to make the race.

The Lake County Humane society are asking for donations of canned fruit and jelly. Many calls are received for these items, and anyone having same to give, will be doing a real kindness.

A \$1,000 reward has been posted today by the Rev. Father Daniel J. Frawley of the new St. Peter's church at Antioch for the apprehension of the vandals who late last week shattered three florentine glass windows of the church with their guns.

One lone thief holding up the Liberty Oil station at Washington and Sheridan road, Waukegan, escaped with \$30 last week. The man was not in an automobile and escaped running south on Sheridan road.

Special election on the proposed change in the Waukegan city government from the commission to the aldermanic form of government will be held during the early part of January, members of the city commission declared last week. The calling of the election is dependent, however, on the validity of the petition.

Although the North Chicago city election is still several months away, efforts are already being exerted in the city to have Mayor Walter Atkinson run for re-election next spring. Atkinson, who has served as mayor of North Chicago for the past six years, recently refused to announce his candidacy for a fourth term, having already held the post for three two year terms.

Accident Causes Death of Barrington Editor; Funeral Wednesday

Funeral services for Miles T. Lamey, 61, dean of Lake county newspapermen, and owner and publisher of the Barrington Review for 40 years, were held Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock from the St. Anne's church in Barrington. Burial was in Evergreen cemetery, Barrington.

Mr. Lamey was instantly killed Dec. 4, when he stumbled and fell down a flight of stairs at his Barrington home, Dr. J. L. Taylor, Libertyville, county coroner, said after completing the inquest.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Edna Lamey, who has lived in California for several years, and a brother and two sisters, all of Barrington. They are Daniel F. Lamey, Miss Julia Lamey and Mrs. R. A. Collins.

Warning Issued That Fake Ten Dollar Bills Are in Circulation

Warnings were issued to Lake county merchants last week by bankers after messages were received that Kenosha retailers had been flooded with fake \$10 bills. 19 of the specimens are in the hands of Kenosha banks after yesterday's receipts.

Federal inspectors are on the lookout for the counterfeiters and believe that these bills all come from the

same source. These bills were well printed and drawn on the federal reserve bank at Kansas city.

Several counterfeit bills were found in the Waukegan State bank two weeks ago. They were sent there from Chicago in a shipment of paper money.

Many people in down state cities were made victims of counterfeiters this fall when some gang reprinted several thousand \$2 bills and made them into \$10 bills. The pictures on the bills are different but the differ-

ance is not noticed at a single glance. Merchants are warned to look carefully at all large bills they change.
