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

Words Often Mispronounced Neuter. Pronounce nu-ter, u as in

"unit," not noo-ter. Contiguous. Pronounce kon-tig-uus, o as in "on," i as in "it," g as in "go," first u as in "unit," last u as in "us," and accent second syllable.

Lohengrin. Pronounce lo-en-grin, o as in "low," e as in "men," i as in "in," accent first syllable.

Second-hand. Accent first cyllable and do not say "second-handed."

Forgive. Pronounce the o as in "of," not as in "or."
