

Postmaster Gives Data For Mailing of Gifts

To the post office patrons of Highland Park:

There will be no mail delivery on Christmas day, Shop and mail now for Christmas; wrap parcels securely; address mail plainly on one side only-include street and number; place your own name and address on the upper left hand corner on all mail. Mail may be marked "not to be opened until Christmas," to assure the prompt delivery of your parcels and cards, same must be mailed sufficiently early to reach office of destination not later than Tuesday morning, Dec. 23. The following schedule is arranged for your information:

Pacific Coast states: Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, Idaho-December 15 to 17.

Western states: Montana, Wyom-

ing, Utah-Dec. 16 to 18.

South Western states: Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas-Dec. 16 to 18.

Near-Western states: North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Colorado-Dec. 17 to 20.

ana, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Bannockburn Club Georgia-Dec. 19 to 21.

Neighboring states: Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, and Kentucky-Dec. 17 to 20.

Eastern states: New York, Pennsylvania, Maryland, New Jersey, Delaware and New England states-Dec. 17 to 21.

Local states (Intra State): Illinois for Illinois offices-Dec. 21 to 22.

If this schedule is followed on dates mentioned, or before, your card or parcel should be delivered in time for Christmas, unless weather conditions, over which we have no control, prevent us from doing so.
