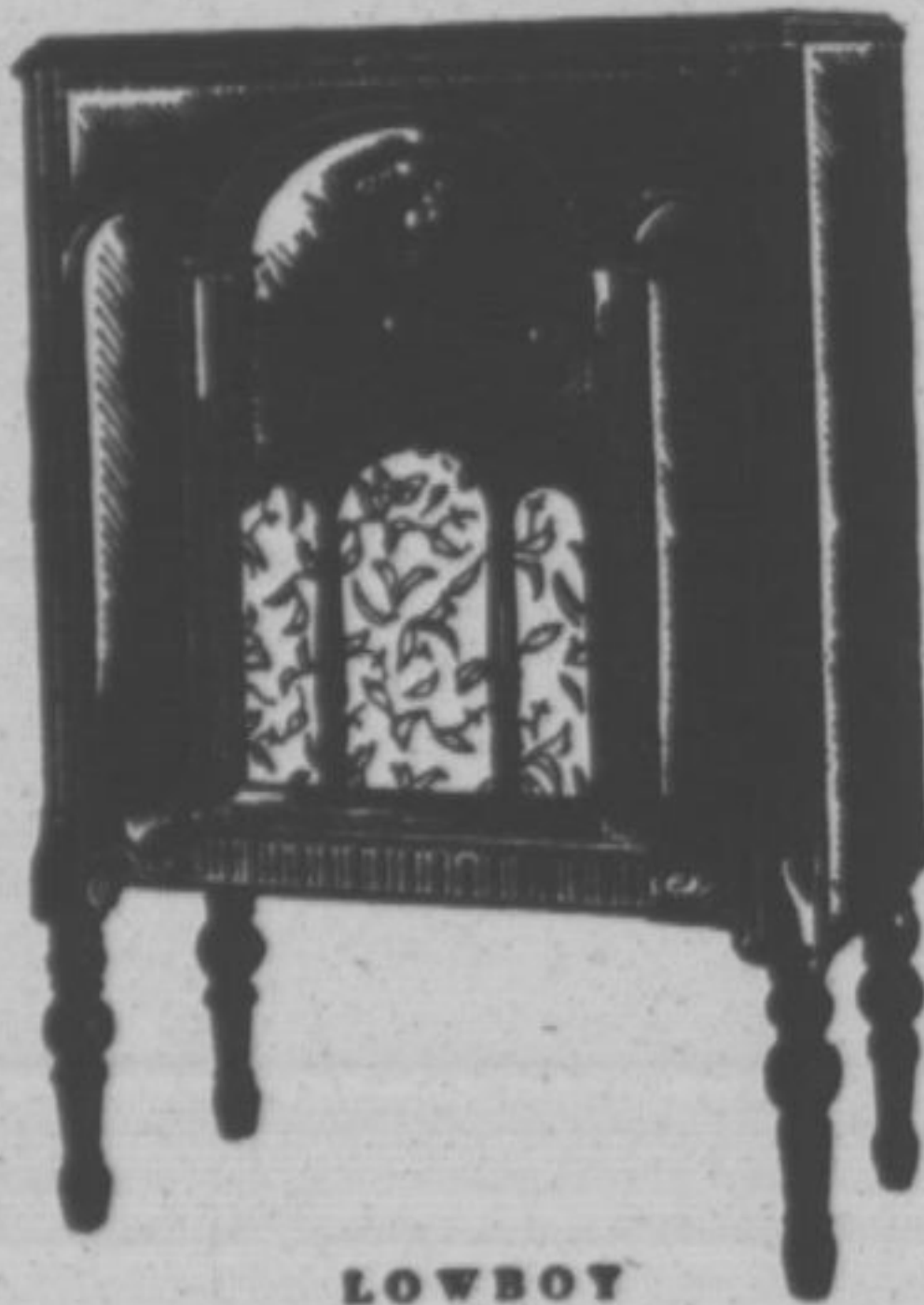

Coming Attractions at Alcyon Theatre

John Barrymore is now at the Alcyon theatre, in "Moby Dick," the Warner Brothers and Vitaphone whaling epic, which is an adaptation of the immortal story of Herman Melville. If you haven't read "Moby Dick," you have missed as much as you will miss if you fail to see John Barrymore in this picture.

The United States Coast Guard is publicized for the first time its 140 years of existence in "Heads Up," the romance-thriller with music which comes to the Alcyon theater on Saturday.

The plot has to do with the adventures—and the romance, of a young lieutenant in the Coast Guard who is plunged into a glamorous assignment immediately after his graduation. The role is played by Charles Rogers.

"Top Speed" is merely a relative term, according to Joe E. Brown, star of this lively production which comes to the Alcyon theater on Sunday and Monday.

The picture features a highly exciting speedboat race.

"The greatest thrill of my life came in riding in these speedboats at between 50 and 60 miles an hour," said Brown. "I've traveled 145 miles an hour in an airplane, but you obtain no such sense of speed in the air as you do through the water. It seems at least three times as fast."

Mervyn LeRoy directed. Bernice Claire, Jack Whiting, Frank McHugh and Laura Leare in the cast.

Thrills, color, clever dancing, tuneful songs, and an absorbing story of an affectionate husband and a too-perfect wife make Cecil B. De Mille's "Madam Satan," which comes to the Alcyon theater Tuesday and Wednesday, an attraction of great entertainment merit.

It is De Mille's second M-G-M picture, and his first with music. The story concerns the marital differences of Bob and Angela Brooks, a masked ball aboard a Zeppelin at which an exotic and mysterious "Madam Satan" appears, the mid-air crack-up of the airship, the descent of the hundreds of guests via parachute—all linked together with songs by Herbert Stothart and Clifford Grey; Jack King and Elsie Janis; and the dance creations of Leroy Prinz, borrowed from Earl Carroll's "Vanities."

The principals are Reginald Denny, who sings with power and force; Kay Johnson, a perfect "Madam Satan"; Roland Young as Denny's blundering friend; and "Trixie," ex of the vaudeville stage, the modern and gold digging "other woman." It has all the exotic feel of a typical Cecil B. De Mille production. The story is by Jeanie MacPherson with dialogue by Gladys Unger and Elsie Janis.

Lake Forest Academy Adopts Richards Plan; of Education; Features

No longer will a lesson in plane geometry at Lake Forest academy, Lake Forest, Ill., mean sitting in an uncomfortable seat, staring at a blackboard and listening to the monotonous drone of the instructor's voice.

As a part of the new "Richards Plan" to make study pleasant and interesting a new type of schoolroom has been evolved. The first of these was put in operation this week.

Blackboards have been ripped out and the "little red schoolhouse" seats and desks junked. Attractive drapes decorate the windows. Floors are covered with a colored composition. Comfortable chairs and wide tables are provided.

The number of boys in each class has been cut to 12 and the old teacher-pupil discipline has given way to a newer relation more in the nature of a college seminar. The study and recitation period are combined into one longer session, during which time the master is always at hand to give advice in the preparation of work and its presentation.

The "Richards Plan," which was instituted this fall, was conceived by Headmaster John Wayne Richards and is an entirely new departure in secondary school education. It has been commented upon favorably by educators throughout the country and has been very popular with the students and instructors at the academy.
