### N. S. Police Chiefs to Meet on Radio Project

Forty-five police chiefs and mayors of north shore cities have already accepted invitations to meet in Zion next Thursday night for the purpose of considering the inauguration of a police radio transmitter to serve the area between Racine, Wis., and Evanston. The cost of the proposed system would be pro-rated among 630,000 people if adopted, and would cost only 3.3 cents a head, its proponents claim.

William Hillard, in charge of the radio section of the Chicago police department, and Captain Moran of the Chicago force, will be in attendance to explain the merits of radio as an aid in crime detection.

### County Board Plans To Provide Sheriff With Two Light Cars

Two light squad cars, to patrol county highways to the west of the north shore cities which are covered by police forces, four new men and two other cars for general office work probably will be allowed Sheriff Lester T. Tiffany by the county board of supervisors, says the Waukegan Times.

This action was indicated Tuesday when the recommendation of the jail committee composed of P. L. Stadtfeld of Volo, Frank Burke of Waukegan, and James Kelly, of Lake Forest, that the sheriff be allowed this equipment was approved by the board.

Following this the matter of making the purchases was referred to the finance and the purchasing committees to report back to the entire board.

Cost of installing a private phone service with 30 strategic points through the county is being investigated by Sheriff Lester T. Tiffany, who believes that the system will be the most direct means to curbing crimes and making prompt investigations.

The phone patrol system, which would be almost identical to the patrol system used by police departments in Waukegan, Lake Forest and Highland Park, would be inexpensive, the sheriff believes.

"I doubt if there would be much expense, and probably none for the installation. The telephone company is making the survey and the report will be turned over to the jail committee so that it can be submitted to the county board of supervisors," Tiffany said.
