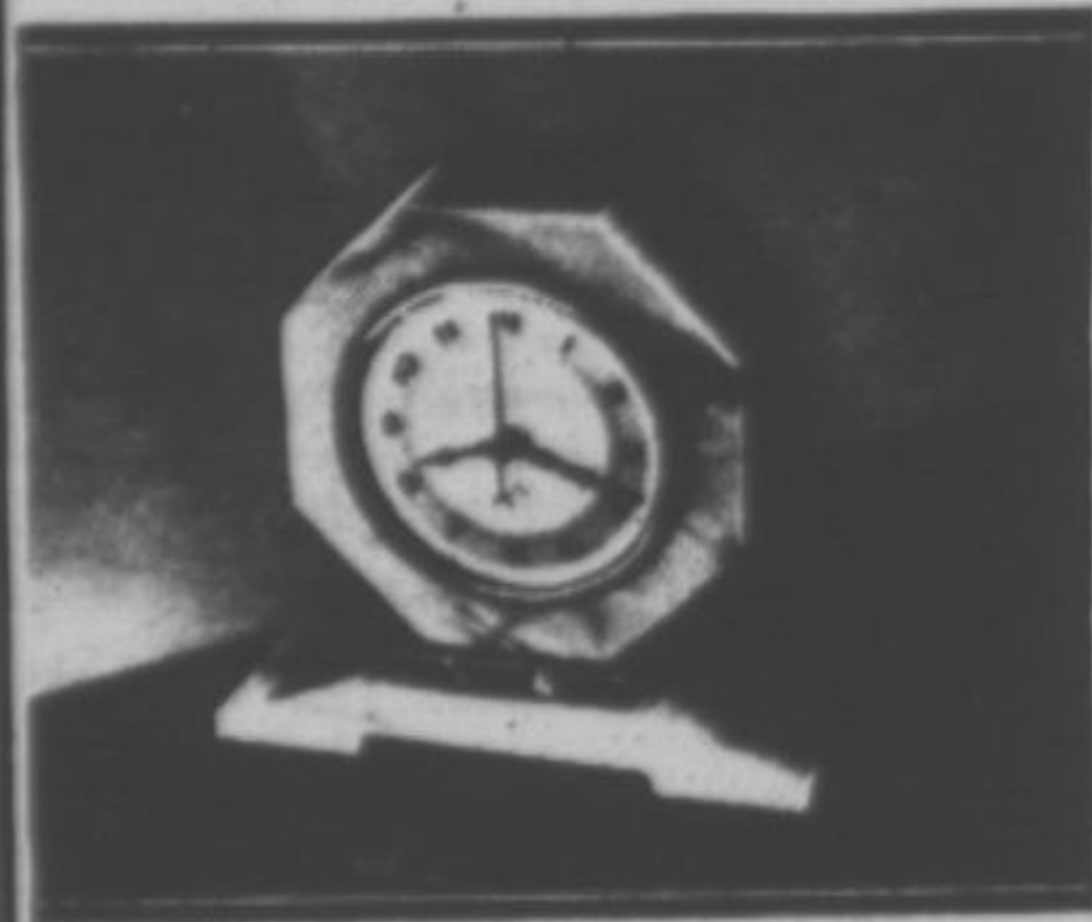




**Distinguished Gifts —

**Old-Time Weapons Are
Wanted for Exhibit on
U. S. S. Constitution**

The National Rifle association has announced that it had been asked by Rear Admiral Louis M. Nulton, U. S. N., to aid in the collection of old flintlocks and pistols to be placed in the arsenal of the U. S. S. Constitution.

To give the restored frigate the appearance it bore in the days when it was to be feared in combat on the waters, weapons of the type that formed the armament of the warships of 1812-1814 are necessary.

Examples of the type of weapons needed are on exhibit in the museum of the Springfield armory at Springfield, Mass., but they cannot be removed as they form part of a permanent collection of firearms manufactured by the armory since 1791.

However, there are a great many arms of the 1812-14 period in the hands of individuals throughout the

country, and Admiral Nulton, feeling that possibly owners might be willing to contribute them to complete the restoration of the historic frigate, has requested the National Rifle association to make known to its thousands of member-shooters and other shooters of the country his desire for the old type arms.

**Illinois Counties Are
Ahead on Road Building**

Illinois counties have already surpassed by more than 25 miles, the mileage it was estimated by state highway officials that the counties would be able to complete this construction season. The latest report on road construction shows that 196.77 miles of state aid road have been laid this year, and concrete pouring weather still continues in a large portion of the state.

**Highway Maintenance
System of State Most
Efficient, Report Says**

Illinois is conserving its \$286,000,000 investment in hard roads with one of the most efficient highway maintenance organizations in the United States, Gov. Louis L. Emmerson was informed today by the highway division. Trained engineers, supervising maintenance patrolmen keep Illinois' roads in good repair. One of the biggest tasks of the maintenance division is to keep the roads open in winter because a great percentage of the state's population is dependent upon uninterrupted motor transportation for even vital necessities of life. During the winter season of 1929-1930, the state's snow removal program took in 7,500 miles of highways, and cost approximately \$300,000.

**Five New Cottages
at Dunning Hospital**

Completion of five new cottages at the Chicago State hospital, at Dunning, was announced recently. This was one of the major projects in the \$10,500,000 building program sponsored by Gov. Louis L. Emmerson to relieve overcrowding at state institutions. The five buildings, having a capacity of 550 beds, will be sufficient only to permit patients who have been sleeping on floors, to receive a bed. Most of the 3,500 patients at Dunning are infirm or bedridden, and the department of public welfare in the near future intends to prohibit further commitments to the institution, excepting when beds become available.
