

A. & P. Stores November Sales; Decrease Shown from Same Month, 1929

Sales of the Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea company, announced Dec. 12 were \$79,820,446 for the month of November. This compares with \$83,713,860 for the corresponding period a year ago, and shows a decrease of \$3,893,414 or 4.65 per cent.

Sales for the 11 month period ended November 29 were \$980,949,625, compared with \$940,654,424 for the same 11 month period in 1929, and is a gain of \$40,295,201 or 4.89 per cent.

The actual quantity of goods sold in November, 1930, amounted to 399,742 tons. This compares with 381,106 tons sold in November, 1929, and is a gain of 18,636 tons or 4.89 per cent.

Tonnage for the 11 month period in 1930 was 4,755,395, compared with 4,302,817 in the same period of 1929, an increase of 452,578 tons or 10.52 per cent.

Average weekly sales for November, 1930, were \$19,955,112, compared with \$20,928,465 in November, 1929, a decrease of \$973,353.

The average weekly tonnage was 99,935 during this November, and 95,277 in November last year, an increase of 4,659 tons.

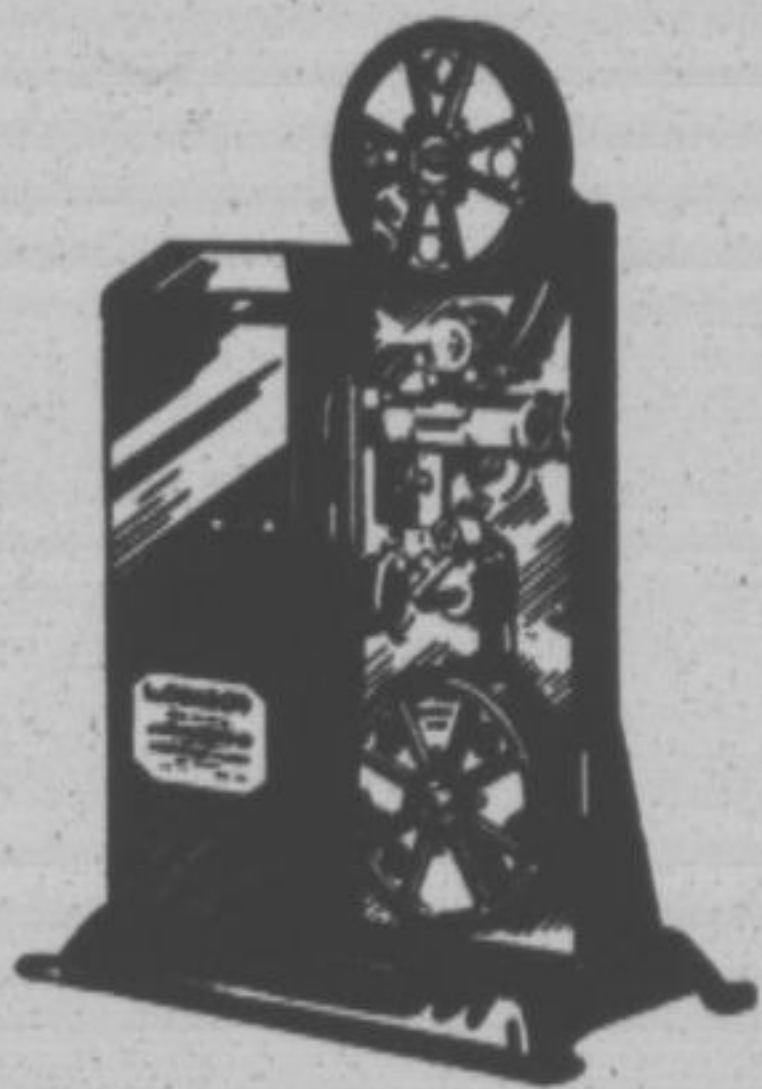
