Appalling Loss of Life Through Such Disasters in State Every Year

There is an appalling loss of lives, and especially of children's lives, each year through fire catastrophies that might have been prevented, says the Educational committee of the Illinois State Medical society. A study made by one agency shows that twothirds of the fatal burns occur in the home and that three-fourths of the victims are children under 15 years of age. The kitchen stove, the open fireplace, the hot water or steam radiator, electric appliances, hot water, matches, fireworks-even Christmas, the greatest of home festivals -are hazards.

Ignorance and Carelessness

Most of the burns and scalds that result fatally occur through ignorance of danger or because of someone's carelessness. Safety education -the knowledge that makes a child realize the hazards of everyday life -is the best way to protect children from accidents of all kinds, including fire. Until they are old enough to appreciate the dangers that lurk in everyday affairs, parental watchfulness and care must protect them from potential sources of danger.
