Illinois Increases

A gratifying seasonal increase in Illinois coal production is reported for October by Director John G. Millhouse of the state department of mines and minerals. The record shows that 155 mines in 28 counties produced 5,233,-946 tons of coal-which exceeds the by more than one million tons. The output is still below the 1929 production. There were 175 mines in operation in October, 1929. The mines worked on an average of 18 days during the week, slightly more than in October last year. There were ten fatalities—one for each 523,394 tons of coal produced.

Does Your Automobile Insurance Policy Say What YOU Think it Does?

Most motorists believe that if their cars should be burned or stolen, their insurance company will pay them the amount stated in the policy. The fact is, however, that the amount named in the policy is a valuation used to determine the cost of the insurance, the rate for fire and theft insurance being a certain price per hundred dollars of valuation.

The policy says that in the event of a total loss you will receive an amount not to exceed the actual loss sustained, the settlement to be agreed upon by you and the adjuster for the insurance company. If you fail to agree, the claim will be arbitrated. This is the usual policy, which is known in the insurance world as the "non valued" form.

Then there is the "valued form" policy. Under the terms of this policy you are paid the face value of the policy, the amount on which you have paid premium, should you suffer-a total loss.
