Finally the boar's head is brought in by Master Butler. A quaint old

song is chanted by everyone as a ceremony for it. Then the Lord of Misrule says, "Now gather good friends, and let us sing the wassail song," and the play closes with that fine old song the chorus of which is:

"Love and joy come to you,

New Year."
