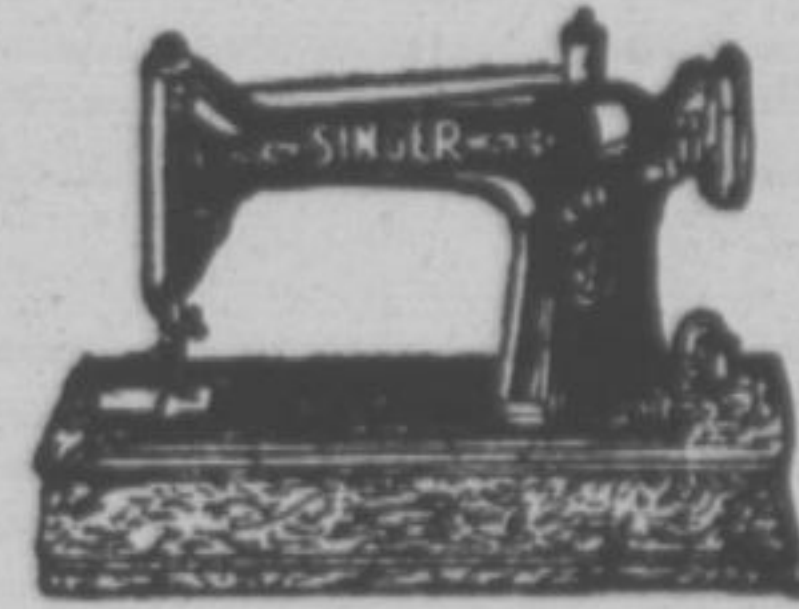
Bakery Sale Dec. 23

What Illinois Motor Owner Pays in Taxes

The average Illinois motorist pays \$10.50 per year for his automobile license fee, and \$17.50 in gasoline tax payments, according to computations just completed by the division of highways. In that the United States public highway officials, through exhaustive studies, find that there is a sav-

ing to motorists who travel high type pavements of approximately two cents per mile, compared to earth roads, it is computed that 14,000 miles of travel effects a saving that offsets the cost of license fees and fuel taxes. Beyond that, the highway system effects direct benefits to agriculture, labor, land values, and the entire economic industry, Director H. H. Cleveland observed.
