of their residents. We can no longer shut our eyes to the pollution going into the lake at the present time.

Rockford, Peoria, Springfield, Aurora, Urbana-Champaign, Bloomington, Wheaton, Decatur, Elgin, Galesburg and many other cities all have plants of the character proposed to be built here or are now building the same. There is no reason why the north shore should lag behind these other communities.

The North Shore Sanitary district proposes to accomplish the removal of pollution from Lake Michigan by the following means:

Plants to Be Erected

(a) The construction of new modern sewage treatment plants at the following places:

(b) The construction of additional units to the present sewage treatment plants at the following places:

Total of all the projects	\$1,200,000.00

The program has been carefully worked out by your trustees and approved by engineers of national repute. The project is right and the project is needed. The cost is very small. It is proposed to retire no bonds during the first four years. Then the bonds will be retired pro-rata over a period of 16 years. The cost to the taxpayer is very small. To a taxpayer now paying \$50.00, the cost will be an additional \$0.64 per year approximately for the first four years, and after that, \$1.36 for the first year and reduced each year thereafter as bonds are retired. Now is an economical time to build while costs are low and while labor needs an outlet. It would be poor economy to trifle with the election by not voting as the preparation for the same costs money. If the election should fail to carry because of the indifference of the voters, it will be the duty of the board and the state departments charged with the duty of the purification of the water supplies of the State, to require the presentation of the proposition to the voters again in the near future, all of which costs considerable money. The board has conscientiously prepared this program, and in pursuance of its duty is very desirous of having the citizens grasp the opportunity at this time to clean up our bathing beaches and protect the source of our water supply.

Vote "Yes"

Will you not look to the health and cleanliness of your community by voting "Yes" at this election. After all, the important thing to keep in mind is that we are taking our drinking water from the same place where we are pouring untreated sewage into the lake. This is dangerous and intolerable. A vote "Yes" for the bond issue will remedy this condition.

All the balance of Highland Park lying south of Precinct No. 14 Polling place—Store at No. 397 Roger Williams avenue, Highland Park, Illinois.
