

### No Quarters for Women Jurors in Lake County Building; Delays Service

Although women have full rights under the law to serve on juries in the county and circuit court they will be unable to do any jury service in Lake county for an indefinite period.

The big tie-up, it seems, is the fact that there are no quarters for them. If there could be a full 12 women on a jury it would be possible to house them in the regular jury room but, if it held some men, it would call for the jury to be split up which is illegal, according to Sheriff Lester Tiffany, says a Waukegan paper.

The county board of supervisors failed last week to tear up its old venire lists which are good until 1932. That put the issue squarely up to Tiffany who would have the right to call women to serve as special jurors.

"I'd like to call them but I can't. There is no place to keep them and a jury can't be split up," he said.

He plans to use them for a coroner's jury, where six would be needed, at the first opportunity.

The attorney general has ruled that the women could serve as soon as the canvass of the vote was completed.

The board of supervisors, at their next session, probably will be forced to consider some way of housing the mixed juries so that the law can be complied with.

All that Lake county needs is a big snow storm so that 23 pieces of equipment to clear highways through the county can be swung into action, it was learned this week from R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways, who reported two new pieces of equipment and a tractor plow.

Townships that purchased new equipment for the first time this year were Lake Villa, Grant, Warren and Vernon.

Other towns with equipment to combat snow drifts are: Shields, Fremont, Newport, Libertyville, Benton, Antioch, Avon, Ela, Cuba, Waukegan and West Deerfield.

When the winter season drew to a close last year there were 13 snow plows in the county.

### State Road and Bridge Contracts in December

Reviewing road and bridge construction contracts placed during December, Frank T. Sheets, chief highway engineer, lists seven projects that total \$374,807. With the exception of the job of paving in Chester, to extend route 3 to No. 150, now about complete, the work is made up of grade separation bridges, grading and graveling—such work as can continue during freezing weather. During the month, contracts were let for road work in Bond, Cook, Randolph, Johnson, Will and Williamson counties.
