Blumbergs to Erect Large Structure on Property in Waukegan

Work will be started shortly on the first unit of the new Blumberg building in Waukegan on the site of the old Central hotel building recently burned, on the corner of Genesee and Water streets, in which an expenditure of close to \$200,000 will be made before the project is completed.

Morris Blumberg, who has been working with his father, J. Blumberg, on the plans for the new structure, stated that the foundation of the unit immediately and that the building would be completed for occupancy by April 1.

The building will tower over Water and Genesee streets with a frontage of 66 feet on Genesee and 71 feet on Water street. It will run three stories in height. On the first floor in the first unit will be four stores, and on the second story there will be offices while on the third there will be apartments.

The building will be finished in Indiana limestone and the trim will be in terra cotta and brick.
