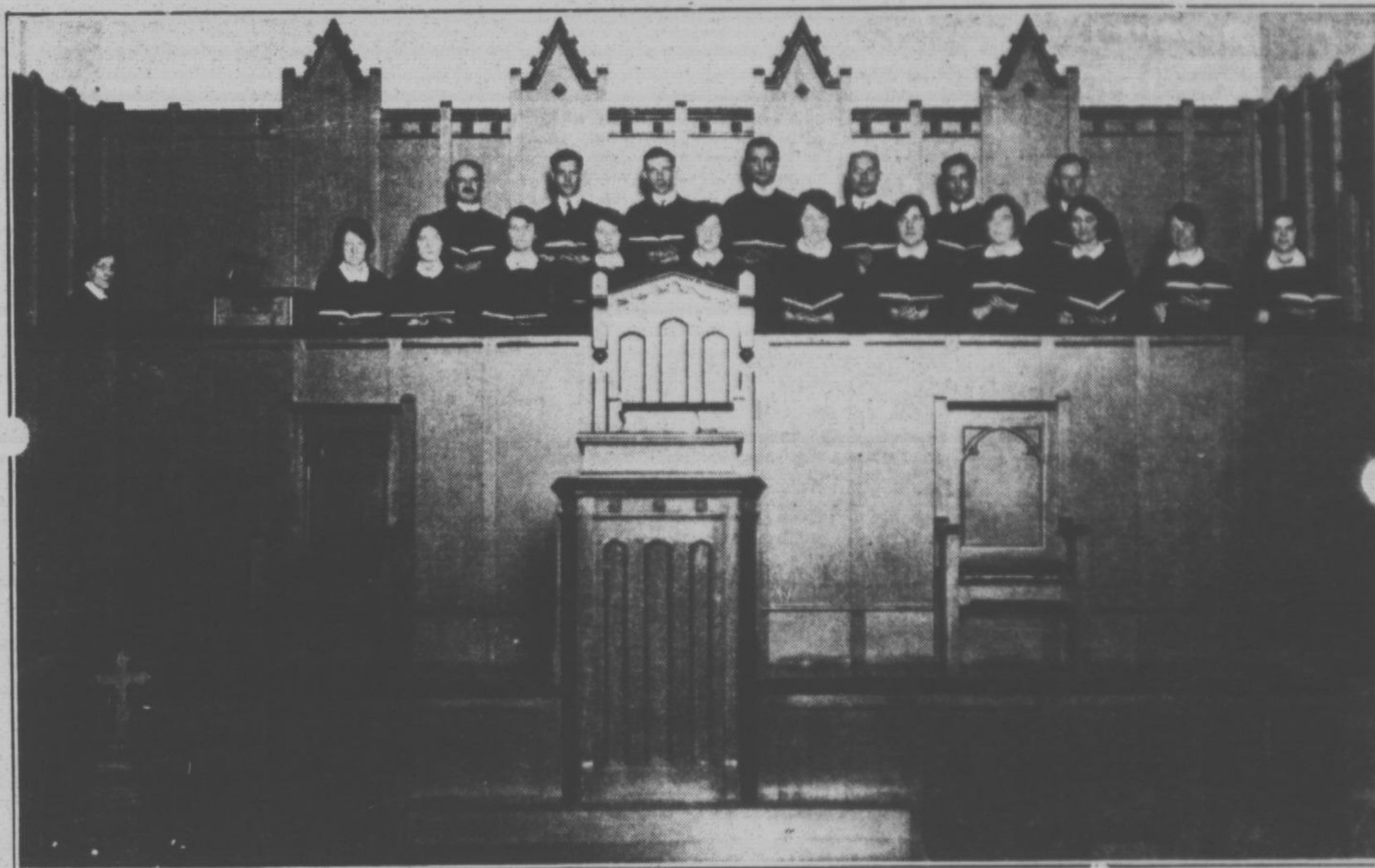


Bethany Choir Will Present Cantata Next Sunday Afternoon

Sheriff's Office Is Busy on Several Cases of Robbery in County

The summer home of Mrs. E. L. Holeman, located on Bradley road, west of Lake Forest, was stripped entirely of furnishings recently she discovered on a trip out to the place from Chicago.

The inventory of loot turned over to the sheriff included several thousands of dollars in furniture, rugs and fixtures. From the number and size of the articles taken a truck apparently was used.

Mrs. H. Swanson of Grainge Hall road, four miles west of Waukegan, reported that thieves broke into her chicken coops and by smashing a door were able to steal 30 White Rock chickens. The fowls, she reported, were valued at \$30.

Deputy Sheriff Russell McBride arrested Fred Kotzman, of Lake Villa, on a charge of disorderly conduct for questioning in the George Efinger Hardware store burglary at Lake Villa, over a week ago, and Chief Deputy Sheriff Thomas E. Kennedy reported that McBride was trying to get trace of Erwin Pester of Lake Villa, and Pete Nurgaard of Deep Lake, to question them.

Efinger, according to Chief Kennedy signed the complaint against Kotzman.

In all there was \$109 in guns taken from the store.

Sheriff Picks First Lot of Bank Guards as Special Deputies

With the aid of chiefs of police and bankers Sheriff Lester T. Tiffany last week picked out the first of his bank guards which he will depend upon for the next four years to aid him not only in bank robberies but in deterring crime.

The first two cities to co-operate with the sheriff were Highwood and Libertyville, but he believes that the others will have their men listed before the end of the week.

"I do not want politicians. I want men who can serve as police officers. Men who would shoot and would be shot at are the type I want to help me during the next four years. That is why I called upon the bankers and the chiefs of police throughout Lake county," Tiffany said.
