Communicating system, including radio on a short wave length and possibly the teletype, will be asked for the entire state by Representative Richard J. Lyons, of Mundelein, when he goes to the assembly Jan. 7.

The representative is not certain whether it will take a new bill or funds out of the state and is having officials investigate before he presents

his proposition.

Mr. Lyons intends to have the entire state divided into zones so that information can be filed with all peace officers, including state, county and municipal, within a few minutes after a crime is committed. It would be transmitted through a short wave radio station to specially constructed sets typical of the ones now used by the Chicago police, and the teletype as well.
