Annual Campaign

The annual campaign for maintenance funds was held in October. It was organized and carried through by our own board with the help of our good friends that volunteered their service. Mrs. W. A. Alexander was chairman and with her efficient committees worked hard for several weeks. 861 subscribed to the budget. We are grateful to the public for the extent of their support, although it did not cover our budget. It will . take planning and cutting to adjust our financial needs of the next year. But we feel sure after the present depression, the people of Highland Park will rally to our full need. It has been used for recreational groups, lodges, clubs, the League of Women Voters, Girl Scouts and church societies, besides our own club groups.
