Mrs. Walter A. Fidler has consented to assist this group.

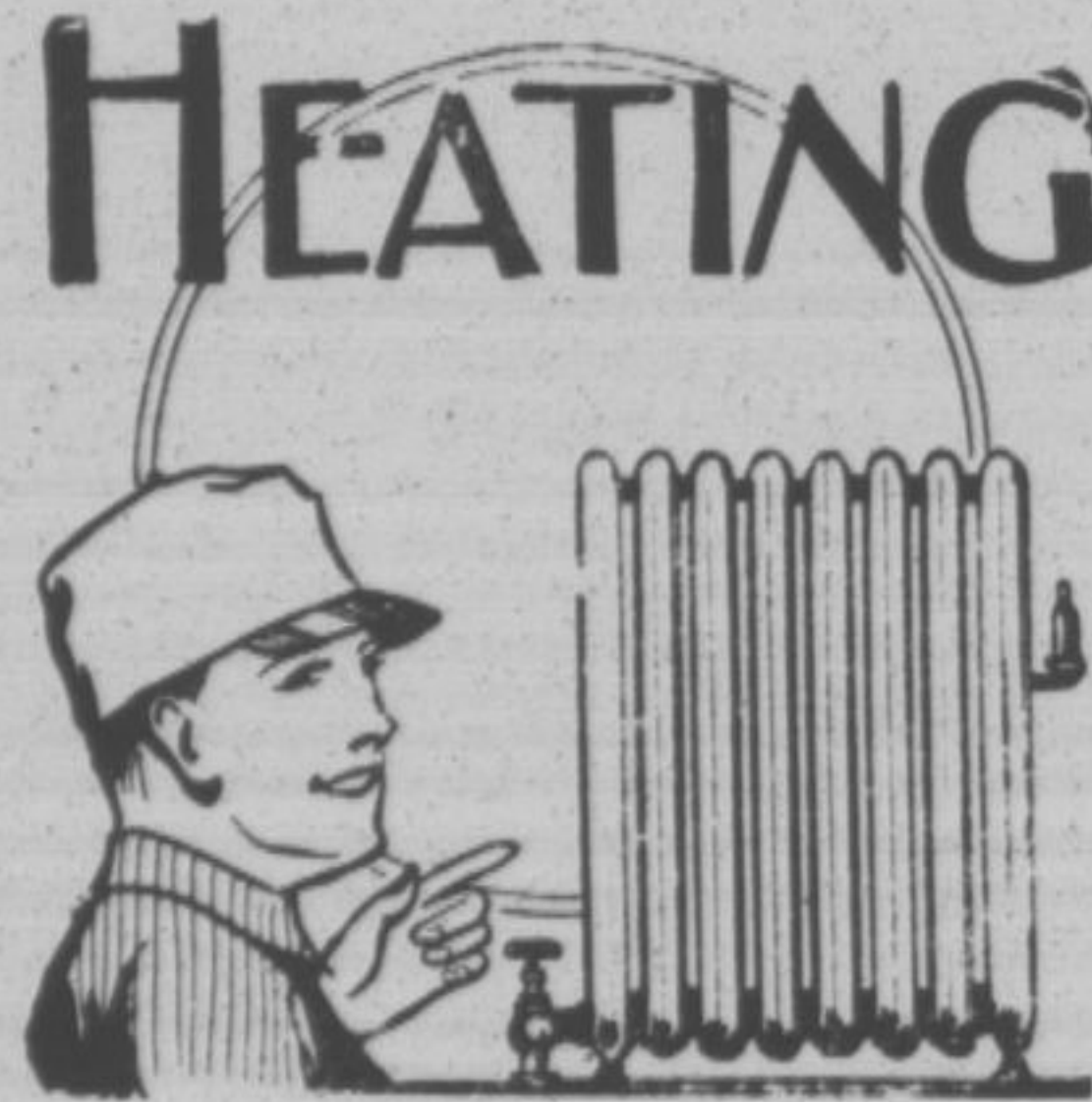
