## DEATHS FROM CARBON MONOXIDE INCREASE

**Census Bureau Figures Show That Totalities From This Cause are Mounting**

Statistics from the Bureau of the Census, which show that in 1929 there were more than three times as many deaths from carbon monoxide poisoning as occurred in 1924, indicate that the danger to motorists from this gas is increasing each year, says the Educational committee of the Illinois State Medical society.

### What It Is

Carbon monoxide is a product of incomplete combustion and results when coal, wood, gasoline, or gas is burned under circumstances which do not permit oxygen to be supplied in sufficient amounts to burn the fuel completely. The dangerous action of the gas on the human body is due to the fact that the hemoglobin, or coloring matter, in the blood attracts carbon monoxide about 300 times as strongly as it does oxygen.

Because of this affinity, when even a very small amount of the poison is present in the air which is breathed into the lungs, the oxygen-carrying power of the blood is restricted and since life depends upon a normal supply of oxygen to the body tissues, it follows that if they are deprived long enough of an adequate supply or if the amount of poison in the air is large enough to cause paralysis of the respiratory apparatus, death will result. Sometimes even though a victim of monoxide poisoning survives, the injury to the body tissues is so great that symptoms of chronic poisoning and ill health persist for months or years.

### Dangerous Exhaust

The exhaust from an automobile engine carries carbon monoxide in dangerous amount. It has been demonstrated that a car while "warming up" in a closed garage 10 by 10 by 20 feet in size will in three minutes contaminate the atmosphere to a degree that may cause death. There is danger also in sitting in a closed car out of doors if it is not moving while the engine is running. Since carbon monoxide is colorless, odorless, and tasteless, and does not irritate the eyes or the nose, its presence in the air is unsuspected.

If carbon monoxide poisoning has occurred, the victim should be taken into the open air and the nearest physician sent for. While waiting for him to come artificial respiration should be performed. Circulation may be aided by rubbing the limbs and keeping the body warm with blankets, but stimulants should not be administered except on doctor's orders since there is possibility of overstimulation and subsequent collapse.
