Bureau Maintained at Chamber of Commerce Office; Win- ter Sports

City Council Fixes March 3 as Date for Primary Election Here

The city council at its meeting Monday night fixed March 3 as the date of the city primary election for nomination of candidates for mayor and commissioners. The last day for filing petitions is January 27, up to 5:00 p. m., but at the city hall yesterday it was reported that no petitions had been filed up to that time. However, petitions bearing signatures of several hundred of their friends are on file in the city hall, and it is expected that within a few days their petition as candidates for nomination will be officially filed.

A communication from Mayor Yager of Waukegan was received giving notice of a meeting of the North Shore Municipal League to be held Friday evening of this week in the Highland Park city hall.

Justice Herman Schwery reported \$233 in fines collected during December, 1930.

The amendment to Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 15 of the Highland Park code of 1919, filed at the last session, was passed.

The resolution presented at the last meeting providing for issue of tax-anticipation warrants to raise cash for the library building fund was adopted, carrying the sum of \$20,000.
