The Park Board holdings are well sites, one of which contains approximately six acres and provides an area for playground recreation, while the smaller sites make possible ornamental planting to add beauty to the surroundings.

These park sites were deeded to the Park Board without cost by the subdividers, Krenn & Dato, and some work has been done on them by the Park Board in the way of grading and seeding.

To the old residents of the district this property will be better recognized as the Sweeney farm. The old homestead remains and is occupied by one of the descendants.

To provide and develop recreational activities, including the necessary expenditures for improvements and equipment, for so large an area, with so many civic centers, is a problem that requires constant study and is a severe strain on the meager amount of money obtained by general taxes levied by the Park Board. Fortunately fees may be charged for certain services furnished the individuals. This arrangement has now been recognized as being not only proper but just to the taxpayers in general.

### Highland Park East Park Board
