Chapel at Ft. Sheridan Is Destroyed by Fire; Pipe Organ Is Ruined

Flames of unknown origin early Wednesday morning destroyed the post chapel at Fort Sheridan, together with its \$10,000 pipe organ and chalices and vestments of the Catholic church, with a total loss of about \$30,000. A priest was slightly burned in saving the blessed sacrament and two Highwood firemen and two soldiers were injured in fighting the fire.

The fire started at midnight and was soon beyond control. All the 1700 soldiers stationed at the Fort turned out to fight the flames, but when it was seen the chapel was doomed they turned their attention to saving the post headquarters, only fifteen feet away from the burning structure. The headquarters building was not damaged.

The chapel was a one story frame building with a two story section to the rear which was used as a clubhouse. The entire building was used as Red Cross headquarters and a church for all denominations. Valuable records of the Red Cross and the post extending back many years were destroyed. Post papers burned included baptismal, marriage, and burial records.
