This has resulted from the reorganization of the boards of review in each of the 11 districts. These reviews meet during the last week of every month so that scouts ready for their test may review them to this group of men before the awards are made. The district chairman in each case conducts these boards of review. Here are the men that as district chairman have helped greatly in the advance: Wilmette—John C. Baker; Winnetka, E. A. Rummler; Glencoe, L. I. Bird-sall; Highland Park, Harry Kelley, Lake Forest, K. C. Cowles; Deerfield, W. W. Mellvaine; Libertyville-Mundelein, H. Underbring; High-wood, H. S. Fromelt; Glenview, R. H. Ewry; Northbrook, Norman Watson and Kenilworth, John H. Law-son.

Although there were 1463 scouts and sea scouts at the end of 1930 against Dec. 31, 1929, there were fewer tenderfoot scouts at the end of 1930 than a year earlier. More scouts have advanced to second, first, Star, Life and Eagle in 1930 than ever before. The totals for the beginning and end of 1930 show these results:

Dental Inspection Given to Children

Two of our local dentists, Dr. Therrien and Dr. Spriggs made a dental inspection of the pupils of the Deerfield Grammar school the past week—grades second to eighth.

Results of the inspection showed the majority of the children have been to the dentist but there are remaining many cavities which need attention. Some of the children are not brushing their teeth as faithfully as they should. It is recommended that they see a dentist at least once a year, brush the teeth twice a day and eat the foods that build strong teeth and healthy gums.

Of the latter whole wheat bread, citrus fruit, an egg a day, apples, celery, hard toast and crusts help to keep decay away.
