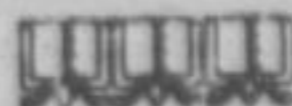

**John L. Draper Becomes  
Dist. Member Trustee  
American Bank Shares**

John L. Draper of Evanston, well-known as an investment dealer in Chicago and the north shore, and formerly head of his own banking firm, has been appointed a dealer in Trusteed American Bank Shares, a new fixed investment trust comprised of common stocks of 23 of the largest banks and financial institutions in the United States. The trust is sponsored by American Associated Dealers, Inc. of New York, which includes August Belmont & Co. and other nationally known banking institutions. Total capital, surplus, and undivided profits of these banks aggregate more than 13 billions and total resources more than 17½ billions. This group also controls or owns nearly one thousand branches or other banks. Each Trusteed American bank share represents a 1/2500th participating interest in the stocks composing one unit. Mr. Draper plans to introduce the new trust shares extensively along the north shore.
