State Tax Commission Meets at Springfield

The state tax commission met last week in Springfiled, head the petition of a Illinois agricultural association for equalization of land tax assessments throughout the state.

Such action probably would increase taxes in the northern third of the state, decrease them in the southern third and effect varying adjustments

"The relation between the sale price and the tax assesment shows a wide variance in different parts of the state," said John C. Watson, tax

"Roughly speaking, the assessments in the northern two thirds of the state are 30 to 40 per cent of the sale price. In the southern third, south of a line stretching from Paris to East St. Louis, the assessments are 40 to 45 per cent of the sales value.
