## SPLENDID MEETING AT THE LINCOLN SCHOOL

trict 108; its present condition and probable future. For the sake of gaining a still wider audience, the following facts covering some of the points he made are given for publication:

District 108 has an area of five square miles, a population of 5,406, and is composed of the following schools and sites; Braeside school on Pierce road with an area of 3 2/5 acres, and an enrollment of 90 pupils; Ravinia school at Ravinia with 2 3/4 acres, and 358 pupils. There is a fifth site on Clavey road of five acres for future development. Mr. Clark G. Wright is superintendent of the district, and has a staff of 42 competent teachers, two at Ridge, four at Braeside, and 18 at each of the larger schools.

#### Rapid Growth

The need for expansion at present seems to be at Ravinia and Braeside due to the rapid growth at the south end of the district. The assessed valuation of the taxable property of the district is \$7,912,862 on which a tax of 1 1/2 per cent can be made for educational purposes and 1/2 per cent for building purposes. Complete information concerning the financial status of the district was given by Mr. Vail in a concise, comprehensive way.

The board of education at the present time is composed of seven members as follows: C. M. Vail, president, 110 S. Dearborn street, Chicago, Ill.; D. M. Blasler, Highland Park State bank, Highland Park, Ill.; George Wallace Carr, 333 N. Michigan avenue, Chicago, Ill.; Joseph B. Garnett, 622 S. Linden avenue, Highland Park, Ill.; Thos. H. Sheridan, 10 S. La Salle street, Chicago, Ill.; Miss Ruth Ewing, 541 S. St. Johns avenue, Highland Park, Ill.; Margaret W. Reiser, 1525 Dean avenue, Ravinia, Ill.

In addition to this number, Mr. George L. Vetter serves as secretary. At present this gives representation of one member from Ridge school, two from Ravinia and three from Lincoln; but in the future it is planned to give representation of one member from Braeside and only two from Lincoln school. The board is non-partisan, non-self-perpetuating, and earnestly endeavors to give impartial administration to all schools.

#### Allen Speaks

Mr. Allen, the other speaker of the evening, is a member of the staff of the National Recreation association. He spoke in an entertaining and instructive way on the topic, "Planing for leisure time," and his address was calculated to arouse active enthusiasm.
