### Trying Horn Signals in Place of Whistles

Lake county residents are expressing favor for the new signal system being experimented with on trains of the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railway. Several trains have installed horns to take the place of whistles.

Engineers stated that the horn is a better signal and more effective than the steam whistle. When motorists hear a whistle they do not necessarily think that there is danger as they can be heard at great distances. But when they hear a horn they immediately look for danger.

The horn is much louder than the average automobile horn and has great carrying power. However, it is not as shrill as the whistle and allows residents of the countryside to sleep without the usual disturbance.

Sixteen trains pass through this district each day. If the new system meets with favor, all trains may adopt horns in place of whistles, railroad officials promise.
