Mr. and Mrs. Charles Rouse and son Bobby of the Udell Apts., returned from Florida Tuesday morning where they have been vacationing for the past two months.

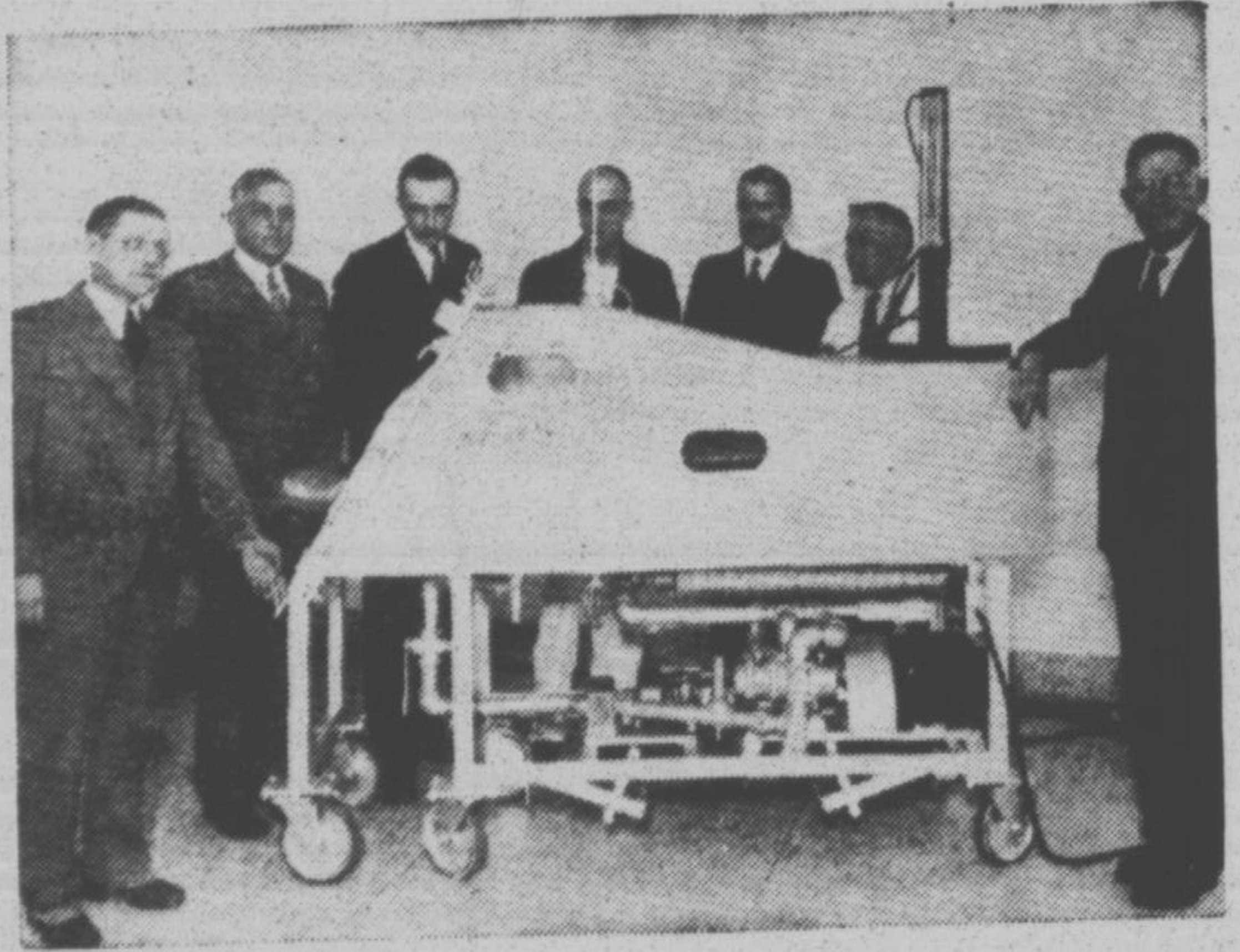
A group of young people from the Austin church will present a Pageant entitled "Follow Thou Me," at the Bethany church Sunday evening, March 15.

Hospital Given "Artificial Lung"



St. Francis Hospital

A Drinker respirator—better known as an "artificial lung"—has been installed at St. Francis hospital in Evanston through the generosity of the Chicago Rapid Transit company, the Public Service Co. of Northern Illinois and the Commonwealth Edison company. It was this device which was used with such effective results recently in the "breath battle" of a young woman nurse at St. Luke's hospital in Chicago.

In presenting the respirator to the hospital on behalf of the three public service companies, Dr. Hart Ellis Fisher, chief surgeon for the Rapid Transit and Public Service companies, pointed out its great value as a means of prolonging life when all human efforts have failed.

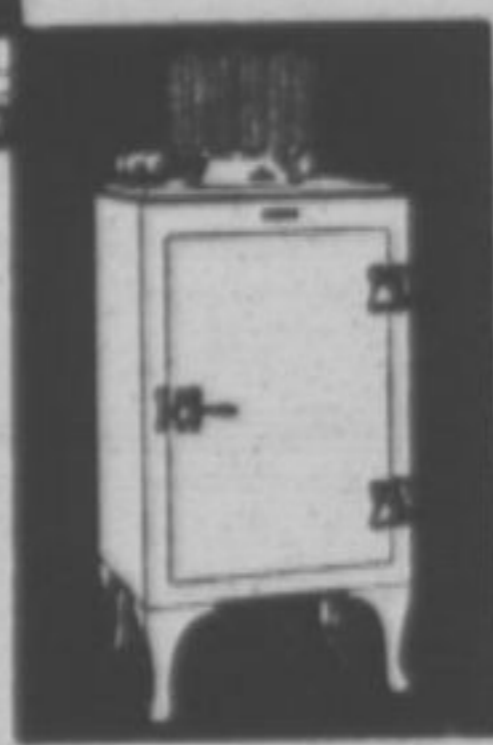
The picture shows the Drinker respirator at St. Francis hospital being examined by members of the hospital staff and representatives of the medical departments of the public utility companies.
