Suit Against Village of Deerfield May Be Settled Out of Court

A buffalo box on one of the sidewalks in the village of Deerfield last summer may prove to be a costly affair for the taxpayers of that village as action was begun last week in circuit court for \$10,000 damages by Louise Huhn for injuries she received when she bumped her head.

The woman was shopping in the Deerfield business section and was on her way to a shop. She stumbled over the buffalo box which projected above the level of the sidewalk. She was severely injured and was confined to her bed for some time.

Arrangements are being made by the village through Judge Martin C. Decker to settle the suit out of court for \$1,500, it was said.

Huge Coal Consumption in Chicago District

The Chicago metropolitan area, its vast industrial activities and its 4,650,000 population, consumes 35,000,000 tons of coal annually, according to figures released by the Chicago

Association of Commerce. This huge tonnage is equal to approximately seven and a half tons of coal for each man, woman and child in the metropolitan area.

Demand for such a large amount of coal is created principally by the thousands of industrial plants in the Chicago manufacturing district. However, office buildings, apartments and private homes consume a considerable portion of the total.

Alleged Forger Is Put Under Bond of \$10,000

Frank Kranz, alleged forger of checks which are said to have obtained money from a dozen local merchants, was arraigned before Magistrate M. J. Haney in Waukegan. He waived preliminary examination, and was bound over to the March grand jury under bonds of \$10,000.

Kranz was returned to Waukegan to face the forgery charge from Los Angeles, California, by Sheriff Lester Tiffany. He was apprehended there when he attempted to obtain money from a Johns Manville branch office on the story that he was a son of a prominent official of the company, it was alleged.
