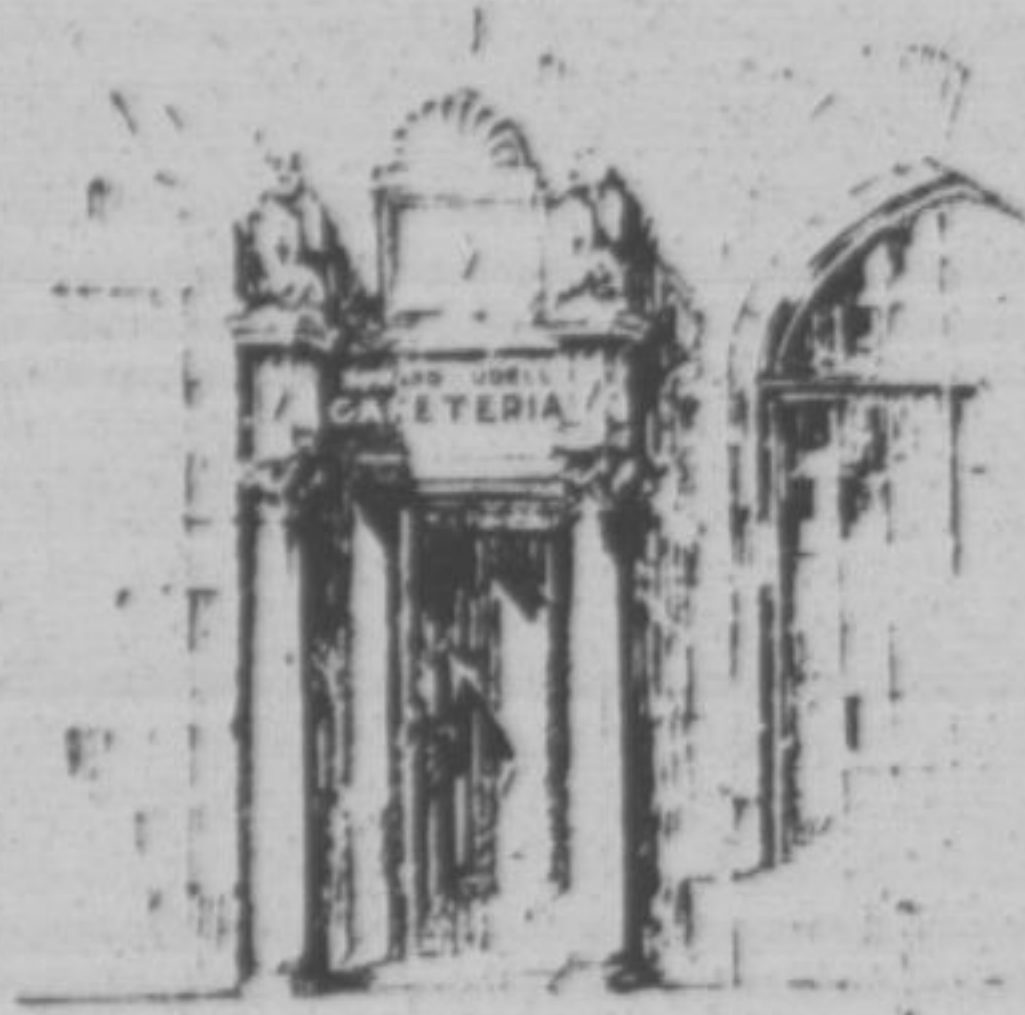

BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

Happenings About This Part of North Shore; Doings at County Seat

Nothing will stand in the way of Representative Richard J. Lyons of Mundelein, fighting for the \$250,000 appropriation for a new armory for Waukegan, he admitted on his return from Springfield.

Mrs. Marjorie Lindenmeyer, 20, of Chicago, was killed last week when the car in which she was riding crashed into another driven by Fred Melhauser, of Zion, two miles south of Kenosha on Sheridan road.

Mrs. Eliza Jane Wilson, 87, pioneer resident of Lake county, passed away last week at the home of her son, Frank B. Wilson, 328 Jackson avenue, Libertyville. Death was due to old age.

With the new village fire truck scheduled to arrive on April 1, plans were being laid today to form a corps of volunteer firemen to give the village of Gurnee, five miles west of Waukegan, adequate fire protection.

Eleanor McDougal of Grayslake, but formerly a resident in the Milburn and Lake Villa communities, died last week at her home. She was close to 80 years of age.

After a chase of close to 75 miles, in which they changed cars three times, four bank robbers who had taken \$6,500 in Elkhorn, Wis., last week eluded pursuers in Lake county and sped on toward Chicago and safety.

Plans for the construction of a new \$35,000 home and meeting hall for the Odd Fellows' and Rebekahs' Home association in Waukegan, were announced last week, by M. H. Rubin, chairman of the home association.

At the annual meeting of the officers of the board at the Elizabeth Condell Memorial hospital at Libertyville last week the following were re-elected to their posts as directors: Paul G. Ray, president; Mrs. F. H. Noble, vice president; Martin J. Casey, secretary, and J. C. Reuse, treasurer.

Through Ben H. Miller, president of the Libertyville Masonic Temple association Libertyville Masonic lodge No. 492 has purchased a \$7,000 piece of property from the John McCormick holdings on Brainard avenue across from the Methodist church in that town, and construction will be started as soon as possible on a \$50,000 Masonic temple.
