AN ORDINANCE
CALLING A GENERAL BI-ANNUAL
ELECTION FOR TWO COMMISSION-
ERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK
EAST PARK DISTRICT, COUNTY OF
LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF
COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND
PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT, LAKE
COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That the general bi-annual
election of the Highland Park East Park Dis-
trict be, and the same is hereby, ordered to
be held in the Highland Park East Park Dis-
trict, in the County of Lake and State of Illi-
nois, on the first Tuesday in April, A. D.
1931, to-wit: April 7, 1931, between the hours
of 7:00 o'clock in the morning and 5:00 o'clock
in the afternoon of said day, for the purpose
of electing the following officers of the said
Highland Park East Park District, to-wit:

Two Commissioners for the full term
of six (6) years each.

SECTION 2. That each of the election pre-
cincts of said Highland Park East Park dis-
trict as described and created in and by an
ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance creating
and defining election precincts in the High-
land Park East Park District," passed on the
24th day of February, 1931, and approved on
the 24th day of February, 1931, be and they
are hereby, respectively, declared and created
election districts or precincts for said elec-
tion; that the voting places in and for each
of the respective precincts shall be as follows:

First Precinct—McKillip Bldg., 554 Central
ave.

Second Precinct—Earl Purdy's Recreational
Center, 364 Central ave.

Third Precinct—Shelter House, 1837 Burton
ave.

Fourth Precinct—Residence of George A.
Nixon, at the northeast corner of East-
wood and Southland aves.

SECTION 3. That the following named vot-
ers of said Highland Park East Park Dis-
trict be and they are hereby, respectively, ap-
pointed and created Judges and Clerks of and
for said election:

is hereby, directed to provide for the giving
of notice of said election and conducting the
same as provided by law and notify the Clerks
and Judges of Election.

SECTION 5. That at said election the polls
shall be opened at 7:00 o'clock in the morn-
ing and shall be closed at 5:00 o'clock in
the evening of the first Tuesday of April,
A. D. 1931.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be in
force and effect from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE
CREATING AND DEFINING ELEC-
TION PRECINCTS IN THE HIGH-
LAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF
COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND
PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT, COUNTY
OF LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That the Highland Park East
Park District and the territory embraced with-
in its limits be and the same is hereby di-
vided into four (4) election precincts and the
same is hereby fixed as hereinafter provided,
that is to say:

The First Precinct shall consist of all the
territory embraced within the following bound-
aries, to-wit: That portion of Highland Park
East Park District which lies west of the center
line of the easterly right of way of the
Chicago & Northwestern Railway Company,
east of the west line of Sections 10-15-22-27,
Township 43 North, Range 12 East and North
of the North line of Sections 34-35-36, Town-
ship 43 North Range 12 East, except that
portion of the Subdivision known as the First
Addition to Ravinia Highlands, Highland
Park, Illinois, lying North of the North line

of Section 36, Township 43 North Range 12
East, and also including all that part of the
Highland Park East Park District lying west
of the west line of Section 22, Township 43
North Range 12 East of the Third Principal
Meridian.

The Second Precinct shall consist of all the
territory and area embraced within the fol-
lowing boundaries, to-wit: All that portion
of the Highland Park East Park District
which lies East of the center line of the
easterly right of way of the Chicago & North-
western Railway Company and Northwesterly
of the center line of Beech Street, in said
Highland Park East Park District.

The Third Precinct shall consist of all the
territory and area embraced within the fol-
lowing boundaries, to-wit: All that portion
of Highland Park East Park District which lies
South of the North line of Section 33-34-35-36,
Township 43 North Range 12 East and that
portion of Section 25, Township 43 North Range
12 East lying Southeasterly of the center
line of Beech Street and Northeasterly of the
center line of the Easterly right of way of
the Chicago & Northwestern Railway Com-
pany and including that portion of the Sub-
division known as the First Addition to Ra-
vinia Highlands, Highland Park, Lake Coun-
ty, Illinois, lying North of the North line
of Section 36, Township 43 North Range 12
East.

The Fourth Precinct shall consist of all the
territory and area embraced within the fol-
lowing boundaries, to-wit: All that portion
of the Highland Park East Park District
which lies South of the North line of Section
28, Township 43 North, Range 12 East and
West of the East line of Section 28, Town-
ship 43 North Range 12 East.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of
ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby
repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in
force and effect from and after its passage.
