Barking of Dog Warns of Fire; Inmates of House Escape Injury

Alarmed at the furious barking of a small dog in the basement of their home early last week, Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Rockefeller of Zion failed to investigate. Thirty minutes later they were taken from their burning home, unconscious from smoke.

Their two children, Herbert and Helen, and a boarder, Miss Edith Smith, suffered no ill effects. Choking smoke awakened them just in time to drag the Rockefellers from the building, a three-story frame affair.

The dog, slightly burned and unconscious from smoke, was later rese cued from the basement by a Zame policeman.

Origin of the fire, which caused \$1,000 dagame to the Rockefeller's home at 2713 Emmaus avenue, is being investigated. The flames started in the basement, firemen said, and burned through a wooden door to the stairway leading to the first floor. The heat and smoke were carried up wards to the second floor, where five persons were sleeping.
