Mr. and Mrs. Jack Myers and two children were the guests of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Myers of Milwaukee on Sunday.

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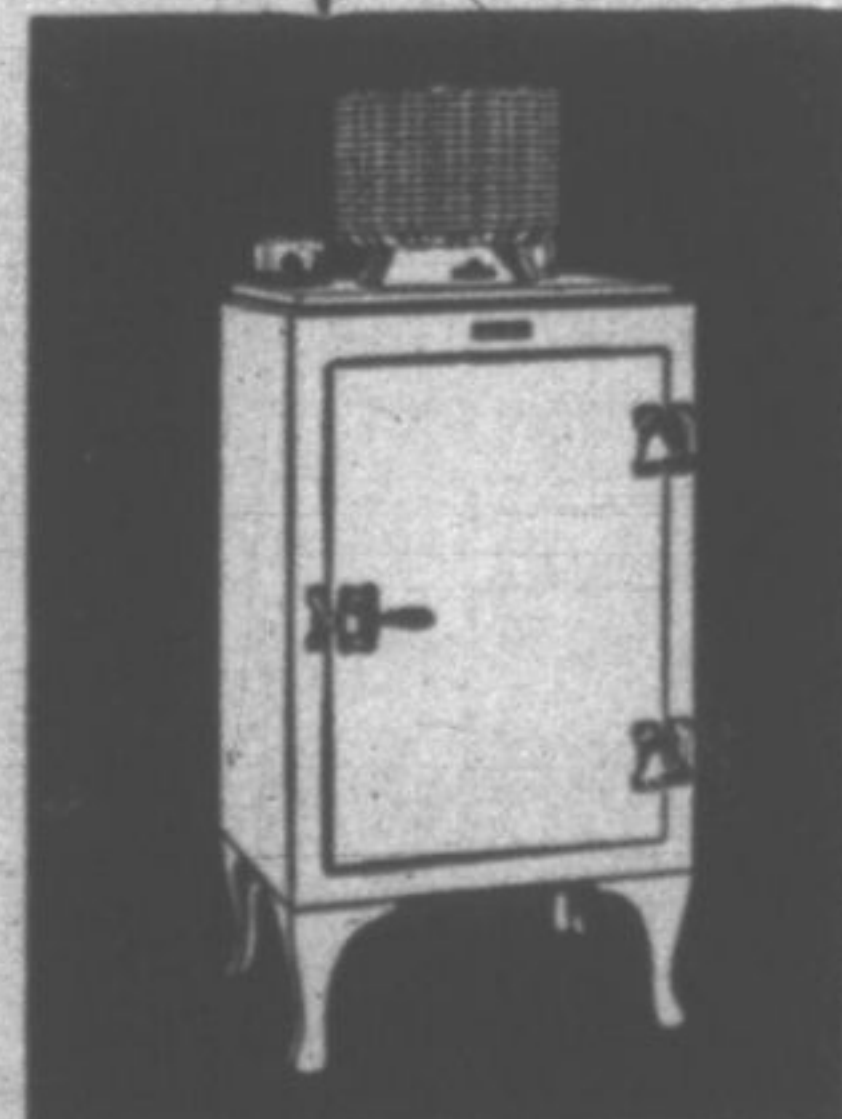
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
