

DR. LAKE SPEAKS AT LINCOLN P.T.A. MEET

"Building Sound Human Beings" Is Topic; Fine Talks Given; Details

"The public health agencies look after the provision of good water, milk and foods of children, and also attend to the control of contagious diseases," said Dr. Geo. B. Lake to the Lincoln School P. T. A. at their meeting last Wednesday afternoon. "Other matters concerning the nurture, protection and guidance of the child are in the hands of parents and teachers, most of whom have very little knowledge of the various subjects involved to guide them," the speaker continued in developing his topic, "Building Sound Human Beings." He said in part:

Dr. Lake's Talk

"If a child is to have a real chance in life, its parents must be educated—and that, in the aggregate, is a tremendous undertaking. It must be a wanted child, planned for and welcomed with gladness; not an accident or a misfortune.

"Neurasthenics and other psychic misfits are made, not born, and their fabricators are ignorant or selfish parents.

"The vital relationships between parents and children depend largely (Continued on page 34)

Mr. Ball of H. S. Faculty Speaker at Meeting of H. P. Rotary Club Mon.
