

Plan to Pipe Gasoline from Des Moines to This Section of State, Report

Plans to pipe gasoline from Des Moines, Iowa, to Milwaukee, through Chicago and the north shore, have come to light, through recent announcements made by the Barnsdall-O'Neil oil interests.

A pipe line is now under the process of construction by the Great Lakes Pipe company, and it is understood, that the commodity should begin to flow through this city late this summer.

Crude oil has been piped from Oklahoma to Iowa and Indiana by the Sinclair Oil and Prairie Oil interests for a long period of time. This plan would facilitate the delivery of the refined product in this part of the middle west and beyond.

In the principal cities along the pipe-line, which would follow the railroad, tapping would provide local supply plants. Now that the line has been re-routed instead, of coming through southern Wisconsin direct from Des Moines, it will run from Des Moines direct to Chicago, and from Chicago through to Milwaukee.
