Bill in Legislature

The resolution, which will be passed by all counties in the state, will be rushed to the general assembly as soon as possible as there is a bill pending there espousing such relief.

The state will be asked to assume the payments of the probate judge's salary of \$5,000 the county judge of \$6,100. State's Attorney A. V. Smith actually receives \$6,500 now, but the state has been paying \$4000 of this, so the request would be for \$6,100 more.


