tanks, which are also made of concrete, and are in the shape of very large boxes. These boxes are partially filled with gravel and sand, and the water is made to pass very slowly first through the sand, and then through the gravel. When it has done so it is perfectly clear, as all the little flakes which did not settle out in the settling basins have been caught on the surface of the sand.

Storage Room

Underneath a portion of the plant, and extending far out underground, is a huge storage room in which the filtered water is deposited. Although it is the biggest unit of the entire plant it is out of sight. It is in the shape of a room, and is one hundred feet long by ninety-five feet wide. The ceiling is twenty feet from the floor. When this room is full up to the overflow, it holds a million and a quarter gallons of water. This water is now ready to be pumped to town.

Five pumps of varying sizes are provided for pumping the finished water into the mains. At this season of the year the smallest one handles the load very easily. In the middle of the summer the demand is sometimes five times as great.

Electrical Equipment

The building is full of interesting electrical equipment and gauges of all kinds, each playing its part in the intelligent and economical operation. A chemical and bacteriological laboratory have been provided where the necessary tests can be made to control the purification processes. In fact, no detail has been omitted in making Highland Park's new water works thoroughly efficient and thoroughly creditable to the community.

At the completion of the job, George B. Prindle, who had supervised the construction, as resident en-

gineer for the designers, Pearse, Greeley & Hansen, was asked by the city to remain in charge of operation. He is assisted by five very competent operators headed by Gus Krueger, so long and favorably known in the history of our water department.

**Paddock's Bill Is
Advanced in State
Senate, Springfield**

Senator Ray Paddock's emergency bill to limit the assistant supervisors was advanced to second reading in the senate at Springfield last week, according to the United Press.

The bill which is being pushed by Paddock so that it may hold up the election in Lake county townships on April 7, of at least eight new assistant supervisors, aims to keep the personnel of the Boards of Supervisors in the various counties in the state to comparatively small bodies or at least not larger than the present.

The proposed legislation would have one supervisor and one assistant for the first 5,000 population, instead of the 4,000 population at present, and one assistant supervisor for each additional 5,000 population, instead of 2,500 as at present.

If the act is passed by the legislature before the ballots for the coming township elections are printed, the six new assistant supervisors in Waukegan and the two in Deerfield township to be chosen as based on the 1930 census, will not be on the ballot. Only those supervisors and assistant supervisors whose terms expire this spring will be open for election.

Under the act the Lake county Board of Supervisors will remain at the present status of 37 members. With the new Zion township there will be 18 supervisors and 19 assistant supervisors. If the bill is not passed in time there will be 18 supervisors and 27 assistant supervisors when the board organizes after the April 7 election.
