Happenings About This Part of the North Shore; County Seat Doings

Rep. Richard J. Lyons last week inroduced a bill in the house at Springield calling for plant protection and icense, the act to be administered by the department of agriculture.

The new municipal code for the city of North Chicago, the first revised set of ordinances since 1910, was passed by the city council last week.

The board of supervisors last week approved the action of the committee in January renewing the contract with T. P. Gallahue, county veterinarian, for another year.


