

MANY INDICTMENTS BY THE GRAND JURY

More Than Twenty-Five True Bills Are Returned Last Week; Cases

More than 25 persons were today named in 21 indictments returned by the March grand jury after a two-day session.

Frank Dzan of Chicago, who has been identified by employees of the Mundelein State bank as one of the five men who robbed the bank of \$3,500 on Dec. 6, is charged with robbery.

Charged With Burglary

Stewart John Randall, George Nelson and Harry Lewis alias Harry Powell, three of the gang of eight persons seized by the Chicago police in connection with a series of robberies and burglaries in Chicago and the north shore, were charged with burglary in the true bill returned by the grand jury. They were alleged to have participated in the burglary of the Stuart Templeton home at Lake Forest and the Sallan jewelry store in Waukegan.

Dr. G. K. Magarian, who has been active in political activities in Waukegan, is charged with subornation and perjury in an indictment returned by the grand jury. The charge against Dr. Magarian grew out of his divorce action against his wife.

Irving Pester of Lake Villa, who had confessed to Chief Deputy Sheriff Thomas E. Kennedy that he made two hauls from the John Effinger hardware store at Lake Villa, is charged with burglary and larceny in two indictments.

Embezzlement Charge

An indictment charging embezzlement and larceny as bailee was returned against Walter R. Rasmussen, who is alleged to misappropriated funds of a Highwood laundry.

Bernard Willieger, Morrell Kritzberger, Martin Kritzberger and Jack Shaykin, four golf club caddies, were charged with burglary and larceny. The four youths were alleged to have stolen golf balls, clubs and other golfing paraphernalia from the Briergate Golf club.

James Wallace, the Waukegan butcher, whose automobile figured in an accident on Sheridan road on Christmas when Eric Turner, Waukegan automobile dealer, and Robert Brunson were fatally injured, was indicted on a charge of manslaughter. John Sherman was also charged with manslaughter in connection with the death of Mrs. Ingeborg Gullikson, wife of a Chicago banker, following an automobile accident.

Two of the four youths implicated in the shattering of three florentine glass windows at St. Peter's church at Antioch on Dec. 2, were charged with malicious mischief in an indictment. The bill named Clarence Osterlander and Frank Smith.

Others Listed

Others against whom true bills were returned were Jesus Prieto, charged with burglary; John Pastor, larceny; Vernon Taylor, false pretenses; Oscar Lance, forgery; Larkin Byas, robbery and larceny; Henry Richey, larceny; Frank Kranz,

forgery; Earnest L. Petersen, obtaining money in a confidence game and false pretenses; Thomas Butler, burglary, and John Jocius, Stanley Miks and Anthony Rapp, burglary.

In some respects this country has improved since 1789. The first Congress had one representative for each 60,000 people, which would give us now 2,033 congressmen. — Boston Transcript.

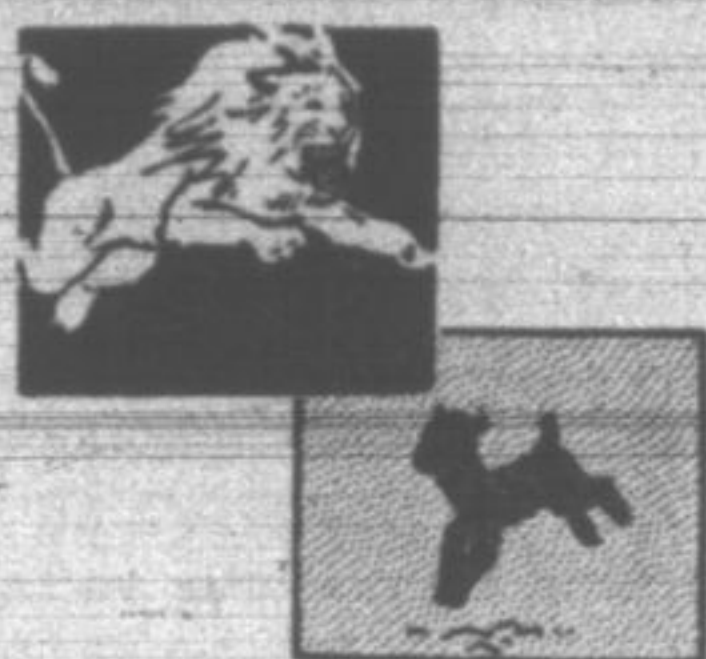
Move for Gas Rate Cut Delayed Until Spring Elections Are Decided

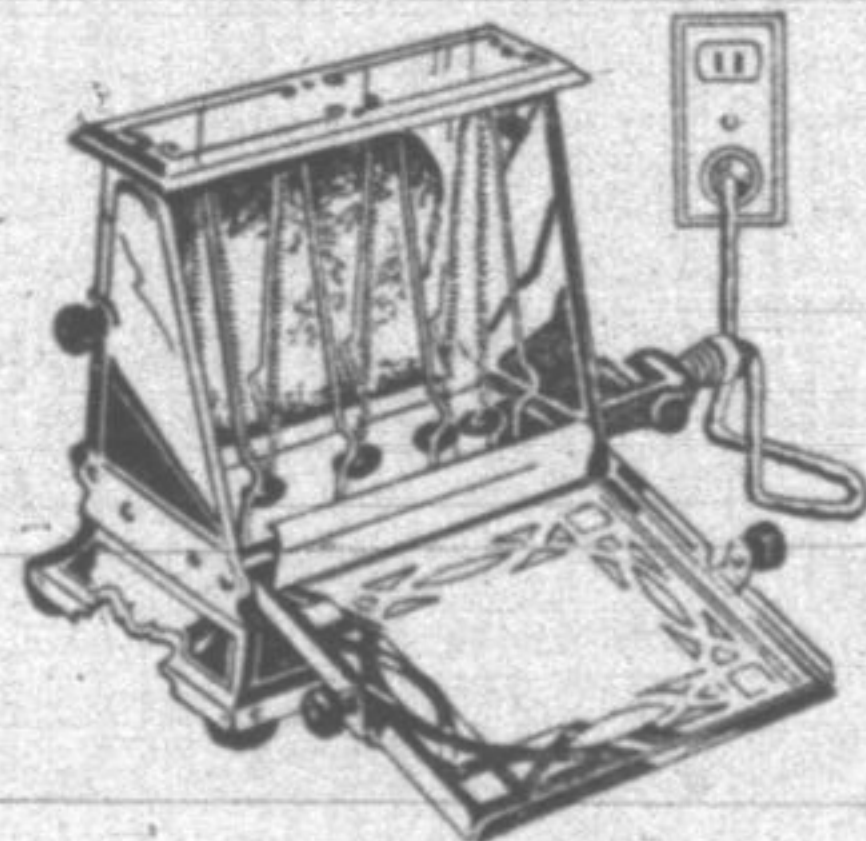

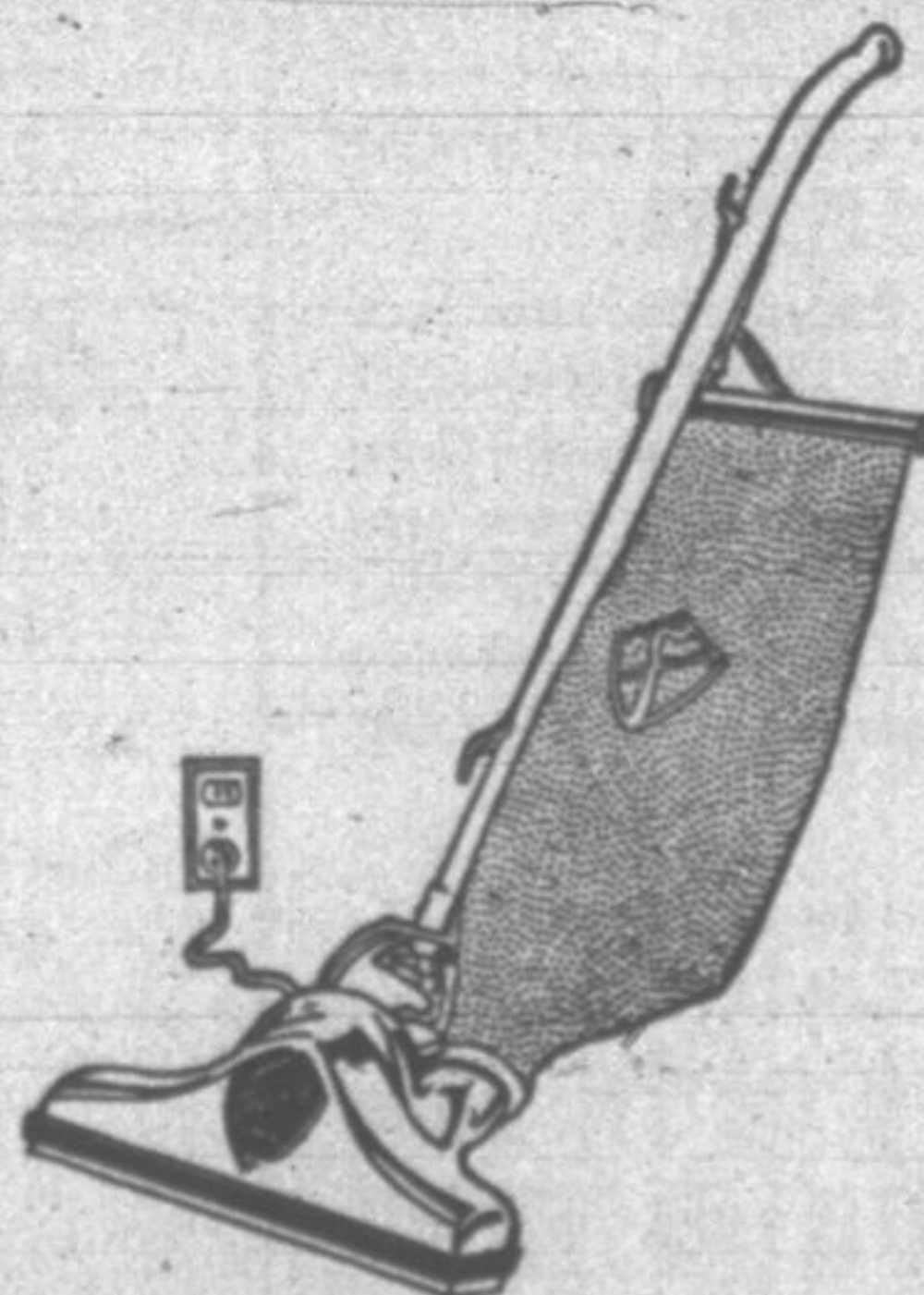
