AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING AGAINST DISORDERLY CONDUCT, AND PROHIBITING HUNTING AND TRAPPING ON PARK PROPERTY, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. No person shall make, aid, countenance or assist in making any improper noise, riot, disturbance, breach of the peace, or diversion tending to a breach of the peace, within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places within the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, or be guilty of any disorderly conduct therein, or collect, with other persons, in bodies or groups for unlawful purposes, or for any purpose to the annoyance or disturbance of citizens or travelers, under the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor exceeding Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 2. No person shall disturb the peace and quiet of any park or boulevard or other public place under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, by loud or unusual noises, or by tumultuous or offensive carriage, threatening, traducing, quarreling, challenging to fight or fighting, and no person shall carry concealed weapons, or in a threatening manner display any pistol, knife, slung-shot, brass, steel or iron knuckles or other deadly weapons, under the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor exceeding Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 3. No person, not legally authorized to bear weapons in the discharge of his duty, shall discharge any fire-arm in or upon any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any such person so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in any sum not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every such offense.

SECTION 4. No person shall appear in any public place, under control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, in a state of nudity or in a dress not properly belonging to his or her sex, or in an indecent or lewd dress, and no person shall make any indecent exposure of his or her person, or be guilty of any lewd or indecent act or behavior, under the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor exceeding Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 5. No person shall commit any indecent, lewd or filthy act in any place, or shall utter any lewd or filthy words or use any threatening or abusive language in the hearing of other persons publicly, within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any person so offending shall be deemed a disorderly person and shall be subject to the penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 6. No person shall kill, wound, or trap or attempt to kill, wound, or trap by use of fire arms, bow and arrow, pelting with stones or by means of traps or snares or any other devices or contrivances, any bird or animal within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Highland Park East Park District, or shoot an arrow or throw a stone or club or other missile at any bird or animal, or set a trap or snare for any bird or animal within any private ground near or abutting upon any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Highland Park East Park District under a penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 7. No person or persons shall distribute, cast, throw or place in, upon or along any of the boulevards, parkways, streets, parks or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, any hand-bills, pamphlets, circulars or other advertisements for any purpose whatever, under a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars for each offense.

SECTION 8. No person shall bring within, give away or drink any intoxicating liquor upon any of the boulevards, parkways, streets, parks or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, under a penalty of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 9. Vagrants, mendicants, idle and dissolute persons, who go about begging, or place themselves in any highway to beg or receive alms, persons who use any juggling or unlawful games, common drunkards, prostitutes, lewd, wanton and lascivious persons in speech or behavior shall not be allowed within any of the parks or boulevards or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any such person or persons so offending shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 10. No person shall play at any game whatsoever in or upon any of the parks, boulevards, streets or driveways, under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, except upon such portions thereof as may be designated from

time to time by the said Commissioners, and under such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by them, and any person violating this section shall be subject to a fine of not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 11. No person shall expose any article or thing for sale, or do any hawking or peddling, in or upon any of the parks, boulevards, streets or driveways, under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District without a permit from said Commissioners, under the penalty of not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 12. No person shall use abusive, insulting or obscene language, or language calculated to occasion a breach of the peace, nor shall any person tell fortunes, play at any games of chance, be drunk or do any indecent acts in or upon any of the parks, boulevards, streets or driveways under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, under the penalty of not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 13. No person shall commit an assault, or an assault and battery, within any of the parks, boulevards, or other public places under the control of the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, and any person who shall be convicted of either shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 14. No person, without permit from the Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, shall sleep within any of the parks, boulevards, or other public places under control of said Commissioners, between the hours of Eleven o'clock P.M. and Six o'clock A.M.

SECTION 15. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication, as provided by law.

SECTION 16. Any person, firm or corporation who violates, neglects or refuses to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction thereof, be fined not less than Five Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each offense, and every such person, firm or corporation shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for every day on which the said violation, neglect and refusal shall continue.

SECTION 17. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are and each of them is hereby expressly repealed.

NOTICE OF ELECTION THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that the bi-annual election of the Highland Park East Park District, in the County of Lake and State of Illinois will be held in the said, The Highland Park East Park District, on Tuesday, the seventh (7th) day of April, A.D. 1931, between the hours of seven (7) o'clock in the morning and five (5) o'clock in the afternoon of said day, for the purpose of electing the following officers of the said, The Highland Park East Park District, to-wit: Two (2) Commissioners for the full term of six (6) years.

FIRST PRECINCT: The First Precinct consists of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: That portion of Highland Park East Park District which lies west of the center line of the easterly right of way of the Chicago & North Western Railway Company, east of the west line of Sections 10-15-22-27, Township 43 North, Range 12 East and North of the North line of Sections 34-35-36, Township 43 North, Range 12 East, except that portion of the subdivision known as the First Addition to Ravinia Highlands, Highland Park, Illinois, lying North of the North line of Section 36, Township 43 North, Range 12, East, and also including all that part of the Highland Park East Park District lying west of the west line of Section 22, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the Third Principle Meridian.

The polling place for said election in precinct will be in the McKillip Bldg., 554 Central Avenue.

SECOND PRECINCT: The Second Precinct consists of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of the Highland Park East Park District which lies East of the center line of the easterly right of way of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway Company and northwesterly of the center line of Beech street, in said Highland Park East Park District.

The polling place for said election in said precinct will be Earl Purdy's Recreational Center, 364 Central Avenue.

THIRD PRECINCT: The Third Precinct consists of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of Highland Park East Park District which lies South of the North line of Sections 33-34-35-36, Township 43 North, Range 12 East, and that portion of Section 25, Township 43 North, Range 12 East, lying Southeasterly of the center line of Beech Street and Northwesterly of the center line of the Easterly right of way of the Chicago & North Western Railway Company and including that portion of the Sub-division known as the First Addition to Ravinia Highlands, Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, lying North of the North line of

Section 36, Township 43 North, Range 12 East.

The polling place for said election in said precinct will be the Shelter House, 1837 Burton Avenue.

FOURTH PRECINCT: The Fourth Precinct consists of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of the Highland Park East Park District which lies South of the North line of Section 28, Township 43 North, Range 12 East, and West of the East line of Section 28, Township 43 North, Range 12 East.

The polling place for said election in said precinct will be the Residence of George A. Nixon at the northeast corner of Eastwood and Southland Avenues.

whether such territory shall be organized as the "Highland Park Mosquito Abatement District" pursuant to an Act entitled "An Act providing for the organization, operation and dissolution of mosquito abatement districts and providing for the levy, collection and abatement of taxes therein," approved July 7, 1927, and in response thereto the County Judge has ordered and there is hereby called a public hearing on the question of the necessity for the organization of said district and of the boundaries of said district to be held on Thursday, March 26, 1931, at 9:00 o'clock A.M.
