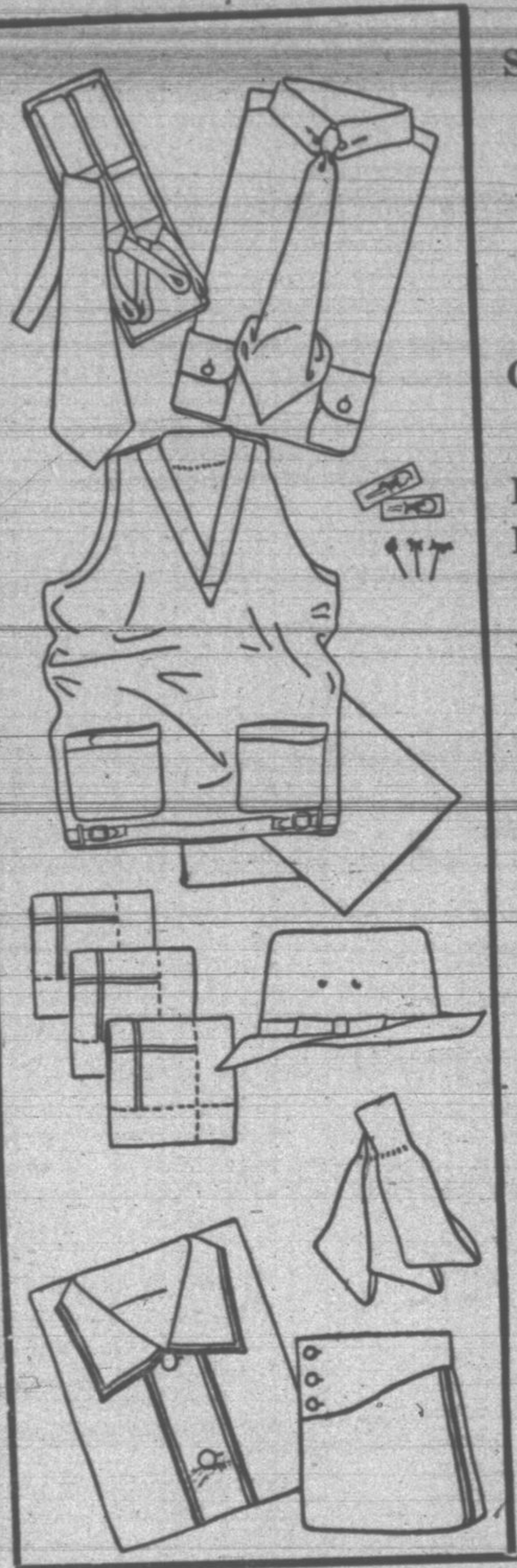

Preliminaries Are under Way for Benefit Municipal Rose Garden May 9

Plans are rapidly maturing for the garden fair to be held at Ravinia station park, on Saturday, May 9th, between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. As stated in our last issue the proceeds of the fair are to be devoted to the establishment of a municipal rose garden for hardy shrub roses.

The idea of having such a garden has evoked widespread interest and enthusiastic response, and committees in charge of the details of the fair are already maturing their plans for the great event.

At the Fair

Here is a brief summary of what you may expect to find:

Plants of all kinds, including shrubs, evergreens, annuals, perennials, rock plants, tubbed and potted plants, window box material, bulbs and seeds. All these will be supplied by local nurserymen. Garden tools, supplied by local dealers, including accessories such as wheelbarrows, watering cans, etc.; garden furniture, chairs, benches, umbrellas, sundials; home products, garden bags and aprons, cakes and candies, articles of daily household use; industrial arts; many lovely articles in textiles, etc. (Continued on page 47)

To Sing "Crucifixion" at Trinity Church

The Lenten cantata, "The Crucifixion" by Sir John Stainer, will be sung by a combined boys' and girls' choir of Trinity Episcopal church next Sunday (Palm Sunday) evening at 7:30 p.m.

This beautiful meditation on the sacred passion of the Holy Redeemer gives ample opportunity for solo voices and chorus numbers. T. O. Thompson will be the tenor soloist, while the baritone solos will be taken by William White, both of whom are regular soloists at Trinity church. In addition five familiar hymns are interspersed through the cantata which are sung by the choir and congregation.

The combined boys' and girls' choir numbers approximately forty-four voices. The boys and men regularly participate in the 11:00 o'clock morning service, while the Girls' choir participates in the church school service and in the special Lenten services on Wednesday evening and Friday afternoon. Ralph F. Anshevich is organist and choirmaster.
