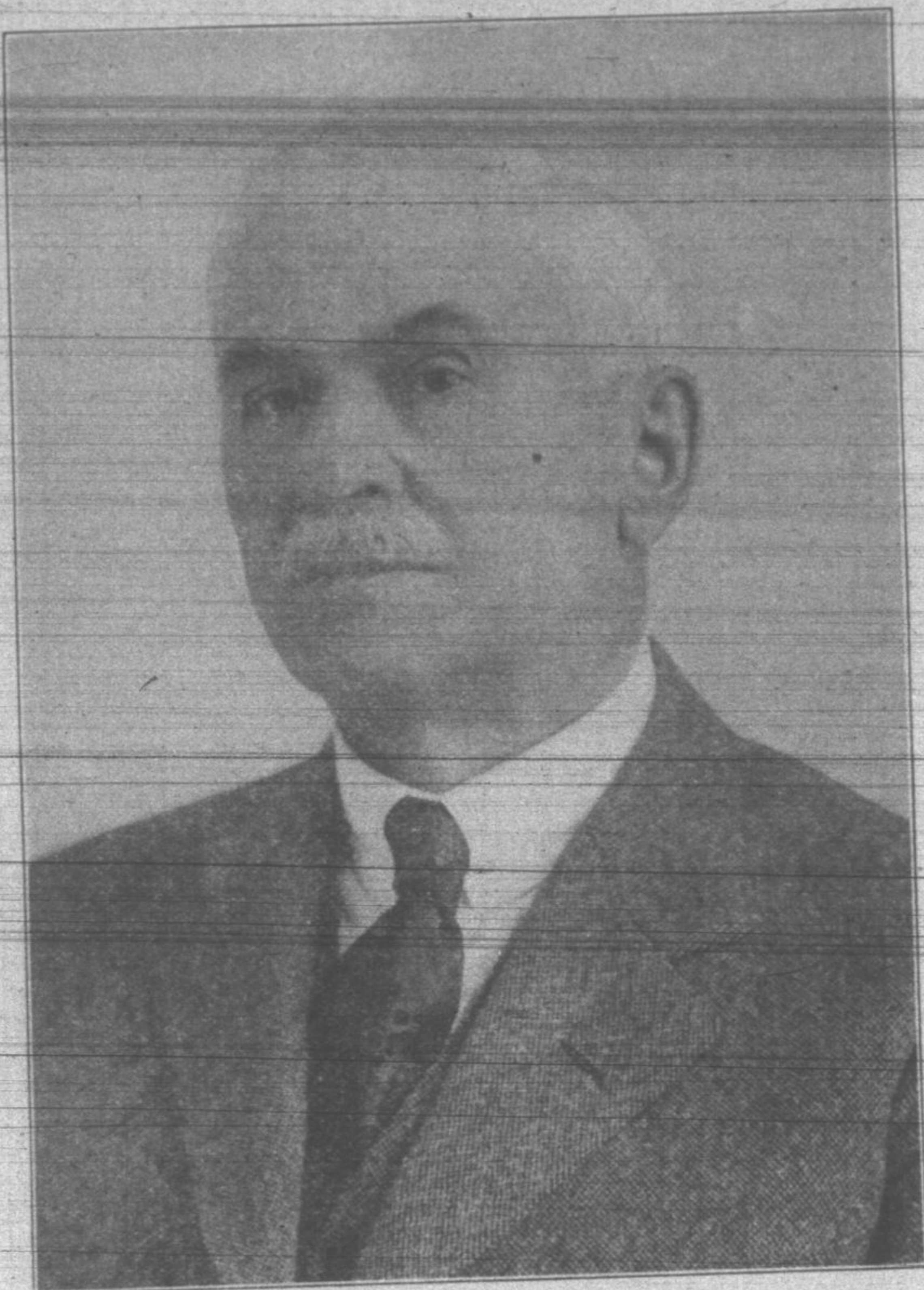


Former State Senator Dies

Words Often Misused

Do not say, "Your pantry is handy to your kitchen." Say, "is convenient to your kitchen."

Do not say, "We came to the final end of our journey." Omit "final."

Do not say, "She is a child of 10 years old." Omit "old," or say, "She is a child, 10 years of age."

Do not say, "I planted flowers on either side of the walk." Say, "on each side," or "on both sides."

Do not say, "I do not intend to eat at all." Omit "at all."

Do not say, "She is visiting her relations." Say, "her relatives."

Words Often Mispronounced

Booth; th as in "smooth" is preferred to th as in "wealth."

Discipline; all i's as in "it," accent first syllable.

Indigestion; second i as in "it," not as in "die."

Dishabille (French.) Pronounce dis-a-bel, i as in "it," a unstressed, e as in "be," accent last syllable.

Bounteous. Pronounce boun-te-us, e as in "tea," u as in "us," three syllables, and not boun-chus.

Inherent. Pronounce the first e as in "he," not as in "her."

Words Often Misspelled

Close (to shut fast); clothes (garments.) Palate (roof of the mouth); palette (an artist's accessory.) Sedentary; ary, not ery. Parcel; not cell, nor sell. Colleague; note the ll. Wield; not ei, ee, nor ea.

Synonyms

Gratify, satisfy, please, indulge, humor.

Sedulous, assiduous, untiring, diligent, industrious.

Outer, outside, outward, exterior, external.

Lurk, sneak, slink, skulk.

Groundless, baseless, unwarranted, uncalled-for.

Perceive, discern, behold, observe, notice.

Word Study

"Use a word three times and it is yours." Let us increase our vocabulary by mastering one word each day. Words for this lesson:

Fanciful; guided by fancy, rather than by reason. "A fanciful man forms visionary projects."

Tempestuous; stormy; turbulent. "We encountered some tempestuous weather."

Graminivorous; feeding on grass and like food. "Horses and cattle are graminivorous."

Auspicious; having omens or tokens, especially favorable ones; predicting good. "It was an auspicious beginning."

Partiality; a special liking. "She has a partiality for poetry."

Tenable; capable of being held, maintained, or defended. "I would be the last man in the world to give up his cause when it was tenable."—Sir Walter Scott.
