

Dump Millions of Baby Fish in Lake Michigan

Five million two inch Lake Michigan trout, grown at the Spring Grove Fish Hatchery, were dumped into Lake Michigan last week by Captain Koppelman, of Waukegan, who took the fry thirty miles out into the lake to the trout spawning beds before liberating them.

Ninety-five per cent of these fish will survive, Superintendent Thomas McCaffery of the hatchery said today.

Two million more trout were dumped into the lake the following day, he said, and two million more will follow this week.

Work of stocking Lake county lakes was completed the last of September, he added. No other spawn will be placed in the lakes until next September, when trout, bass, and perch fingerlings will be placed in the lakes.
