#### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held in the Council Chamber in the City Hall in the City of Highland Park, Illinois, on Friday, the 10th day of April, 1931, at eight o'clock P. M., which said public hearing will be conducted by the undersigned, the Zoning Committee for the City of Highland Park, designated and appointed by the Council of the City of Highland Park for that purpose to consider amending an ordinance entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE amending an Ordinance Entitled 'An Ordinance to regulate and limit the height and bulk of buildings; to regulate and limit the intensity of the use of lot areas, and to regulate and determine the areas of open spaces within and surrounding such buildings; to classify, regulate, and restrict the location of trades and industries and the location of buildings designed for specified industrial, business, residential, and other uses; to divide the entire City of Highland Park into districts for the purpose of this ordinance; to fix standards to which buildings or structures shall conform; to prohibit uses, buildings, or structures incompatible with the character of such districts respectively; and to prevent additions to and alterations or remodeling of existing buildings or structures in such a way as to avoid the restrictions and limitations lawfully imposed hereunder and to provide penalties for violation hereof,' as amended" in the following manner:

It is proposed that the Northerly 20 feet of Lot 7 Block 6, City of Highland Park which is now classified as Class "B" Residential, be rezoned as Class "C" or Business Property.

At said public hearing an opportunity will be afforded to all persons interested in the change above mentioned to be heard in relation to said proposed amendment.
