Time Limit Is Close For Veterans to Sue For Insurance Claims

itation committee of the American Legion, has issued the following statement to warn veterans of their rights.

"July 3, 1931, is an important date to veterans who claim insurance benefits because of permanent and total disability, for under the present law the right generally to bring suit expires on that date if permanent and total disability is claimed as of any date before July 3, 1925.

"It is also important to remember that before suit may be filed under the existing law, a claim for insurance must now be denied by the administrator of Veterans' Affairs.


