ISADORE SMITH MEMBER OF WINNING DEBATING TEAM

Representing the 1931 debating team of Lake Forest college, Isadore Smith, Deerfield graduate of 1928, along with Elmer Peterson of Minnesota, and Jack Miller of Chicago, has just returned from a successful 1,000 mile tour.

Visiting Miami college, Ohio State college at Oxford, Ohio, and DePauw university at Queenscastle, Indiana, the Lake Forest team presented the negative side of the argument: Resolved: that the several states should enact laws providing for unemployment insurance.
