**Happenings About This Part of
North Shore; Doings at
County Seat**

The Illinois house municipalities committee last week recommended the passage of the measure that would permit the Homer Dahringer Post of the American Legion to erect a memorial in the Waukegan park system.

Louis Hankins, colored, of North Chicago, who chopped his wife, Inez, 19, to death with an ax, was held to the grand jury on a charge of murder without bond by Justice Harold Tallett of North Chicago.

The Illinois house last week passed Rep. Lyons' bill making it a misdemeanor for any person failing to muffle the exhaust of any motor boat except during motor boat races. The bill now goes to the senate.

Fred C. Harter, a life-long resident of Waukegan, died there last week.

The Illinois Commerce commission last week authorized Lake county and Benton township to extend Wadsworth road underneath the North Shore line tracks at a point just south of the city limits of Zion.

Waukegan township high school's 102-piece band placed third in the district competition at Cicero recently, playing against strong opposition from six other Class A aggregations. Proviso township high school was first and Sterling Morton second.

Receipt of \$31,250 from the state treasury for gasoline tax due the county for the month of August was announced recently by County Clerk Lew A. Hendee. The money is to be used for the road bond issue passed in the spring.

Fire believed to have started from defective electric wiring recently completely destroyed the residence of Clair McKey, owner and manager of the Waukegan Dahlia Farms on Green Bay and York House roads. The loss was estimated at \$8,000 with \$6,000 insurance to cover.

Charles Boss, who was born on board ship as his parents immigrated to America from Germany and who spent most of his life on a farm east of Half Day, died last week in the Lake county hospital after an illness of three months. He was eighty years old.

John Yore, deceased, Deerfield. Petition set for hearing. Real estate \$50,000. Set for hearing April 27, 1931.

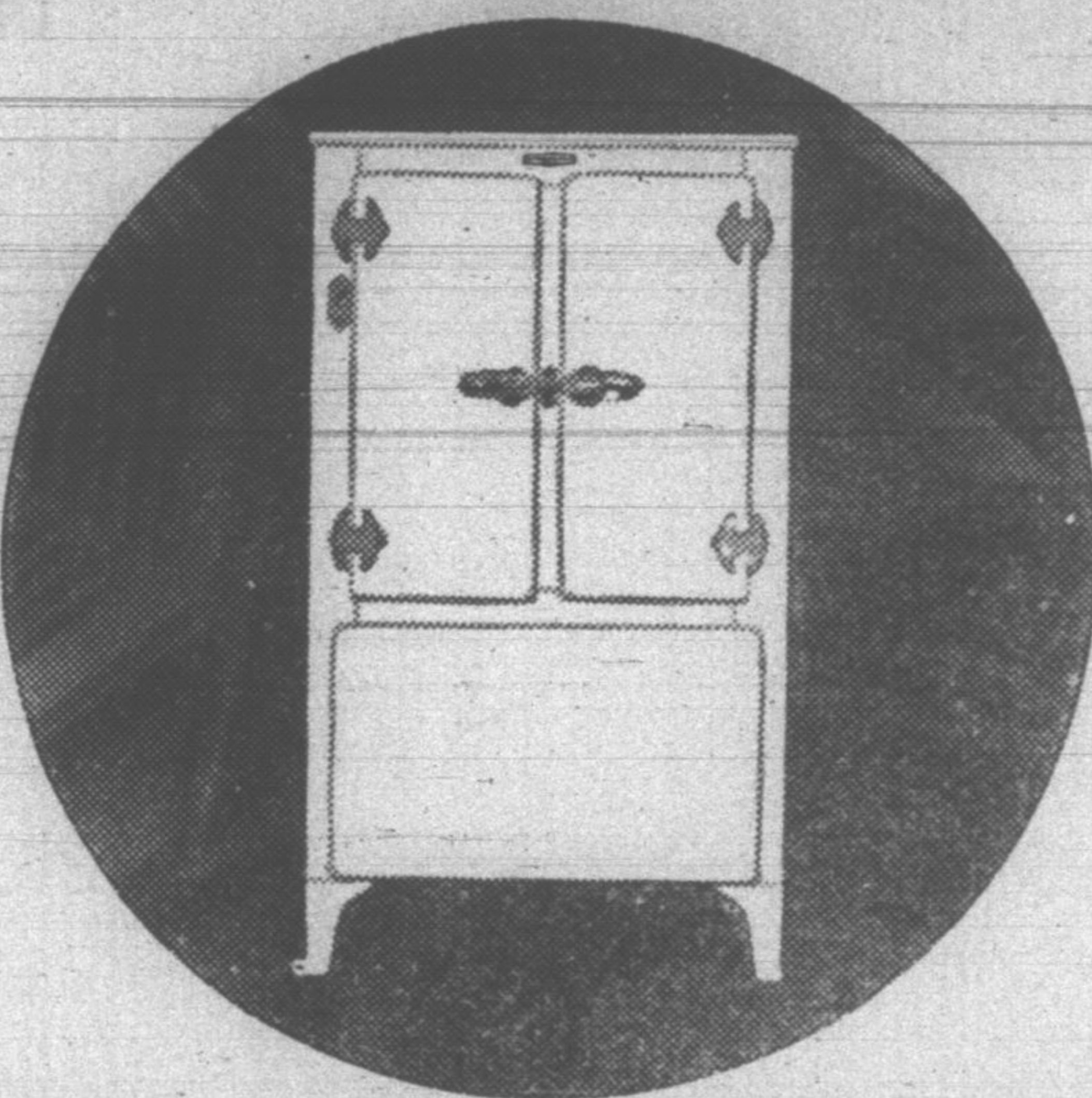
